Born in Czechoslavakia: Half of town was Jewish: Father sold wine and liquor and mineral waters. Population composed of Jews, Hungarians and Ukranians; Attended Czech schools; Had good life; Local population was antisemitic; In 1939 their area became Hungarian; Hungary was part of axis and took away licenses to practice their business; Had to have private tutoring as unable to go to school; Young Jewish men were taken to work behind lines, many killed; Trainloads of Jewish people of Polish origin transported away; Some escaped came back and told others; Very frightening; Father was beaten by police because he secretly sold mineral water after store was taken over by Hungarian man; Lived like that for five years until 1944 when Germans came in; One sister lived in Budapest and was caught; Passover Eve father didn't come home: Shaved beard and shed Hasidic robe and hat; Created two ghettoes; Two families slept in one bedroom; Sister ran out and returned with horse and buggy to take out all of their material belongings; Father said only "Let us all just be alive;" Took them to Railroad station on May 23; Father carried small pair of shoes for daughter who had been t aken away; Seventy people in one baggage car with one toilet and no protection; Traveled two days and arrived in Aushwitz; Father felt it was the end; Doors were opened and people were husteld out; Impossible to stay together; Were separated and undressed; Gave them ill-fitting clothes; Used material to cover hads and protect from cold; Barracks had dirt floors with mud puddles; One thousand people in one barrack; Ate bread which tasted like sawdust; Each barrack was i00 yards by 20 feet wide; Compartments were 8 feet by 5 feet with 16 people in each compartment with no blankets; Slept this way for six months - cold and hungry; Under roof was a slit which they used as a window; Could see men being taken away; father being taken but was unable to get to him and never saw him again; Mother became ill and couldn't eat; Tried to keep her away from soldiers; Knew she would not survive selection; Rains came and caught dysentary; Roll call line for hours with nowhere to go to the bathroom; People fought for bathrooms; Much thirst and deprivation; Selections took place five times a day when Germans realized that Russians were coming; Selection is described and how they hid their mother behind a cupboard; This is a verbatim transcript of spoken word. It is not the primary source, and it has not been checked for spelling or accuracy.

Father didn't survive but mother still alive today and living in Brooklyn, New York
