- 1.01 Born in 1912 in Izbitsa, Poland. Describes his family and his life as a youngster. Worked afterschool in a pharmacy until 1938 and then went to Warsaw.
- 1.04 When war broke out in 1939 he joined the Polish army as a medic. Describes bombing of Warsaw.
- 1.07 Tried to escape Warsaw but did not succeed and returned to Izbitsa.
- 1.13 Was taken to work camp Bortaycze and then returned to work as a medic in the Izbitsa hospital during typhoid epidemic.
- 1.26 April 1943, describes transport to Sobibor.
- 1.30 Fate of his parents.
- 1.37 Describes camp Sobibor and his work in the pharmacy.
- 1.44 Talks about S.S. Wagner and Frenzel.
- 1.56 Arrival of transport from Russia.
- 2.00 Escape plans.
- 2.04 Beatings by Frenzel and cruel punishments that he and others suffered.
- 2.25 Escape attempts.
- 2.27 Arrival of transport from Minsk and the extermination and burning of inmates.
- 2.30 Plans and escape of 300 prisoners from Sobibor.
- 2.50 His escape to the forest and survival in the villages near Izbitsa.
- 3.08 Liberation by Russian army and incidents with anti-Semitic Poles.
- 3.14 Information about Belzec and other camps before he went to Sobibor.
- 3.23 S.S. Wagner and his criminal activities.
- 3.27 Food in Sobibor.
- 3.36 His plan to poison the guards and escape.

- 3.43 The “naked” transport.
- 3.47 Transport of young girls for medical experiments; Eichman present at their gassing.
- 3.50 Zamoch after liberation. He got married there.
- 3.53 He went to Berlin and from there to Heidenheim; lived there for 2-3 years until he went to Israel.
