SUMMARY: Born in Lodz. Following the occupation of the town by the Germans he moved around Poland until captured and sent to Skarzysko C camp. Hardly anybody survived the camp because the prisoners had to handle toxic materials without minimal protection, a practice that led to inevitable death within a few weeks. After he learned what was in store for him he made contact with the youth movement he belonged to through the local underground and was aided in his escape from the camp. Made it to the nearby forest, where he hid with a group of Jews for over a year, from the Germans as well as the Poles who hunted them, until his group was liberated by the Russians.
