SUMMARY: Born in 1927 in Yugoslavia. On the day that the Jews of Belgrade (Beograde) were called for transportation, escaped to Nis and stayed there as an Aryan during the years 1942-1944. Became a member of the Yugoslavian underground. At the end of 1944 she was captured by the Germans and transported through several forced labor camps until arriving at a Gestapo prison in Berlin. She was tried and sentenced to death, but liberated by the Red Army and returned to Yugoslavia where she worked as a journalist. During the purges under the Tito government she was sent to a forced labor camp for women for two and a half years. Arrived in Israel finally in the 1960's.
