SUMMARY: Born in 1913 in Amsterdam. Was an officer in the Dutch Army and a member of "Bethar". At the beginning of the war he left the army and hid with his wife in a Dutch village near Hilversum under false identities. Joined the general underground in the Netherlands and his main job was to hide Jewish children and adults in Christian homes. He was captured and sent to the prisoner's camp Vught. When his Jewishness was revealed he was transported through Westerbork to Birkenau and from there to Auschwitz 3 (Buna). At the end of 1944 he was transported to Dora camp and was liberated by the American army.
