SUMMARY: Miriam Pinkoff - from Lundstrecht, a town in Holland, a member of the Jewish-Christian underground in Holland, which was Zionist and cooperated with Christian groups in Holland under the leadership of Joop Westerweel. Concealed Jewish children; some of them survived and are alive today. Was caught and sent to Bergen-Belsen. During this testimony a unique phenomenon was encountered: a great interest on the part of the family, three children, in their parents' personal histories (Their father had been a leader in the same underground group and died a few years ago.). A first attempt at a unique recording: a family encounter dealing with the issue of raising children when both parents are Holocaust survivors.
