SUMMARY: Born in 1927 in Lodz. Spent most of the war in the ghetto with her family. When the ghetto was liquidated she was transported to Auschwitz, and later to Stutthof. There she stayed during the last months of the war, and before the liberation of the camp by the Russians she was shipped to Germany with the remaining prisoners in 12 ships. Most of the ships, including hers, drowned by Allied aircrafts. She and others were rescued by a German warship. Arrived at a beach in north Germany and was liberated by the British (the witness has lives in Paraguay and the testimony was given in Spanish).
