SUMMARY: Born in 1927 in Krakow, Poland where he still lived when it was captured by the Germans. Was one of the first prisoners of the Plaszow Camp, where he was a forced labourer until the middle of 1944, when he was transported to Mauthausen. He stayed at Gusen 1 and Gusen 2 (sub camps of Mauthausen) and worked at the notorious quarry of Mauthausen for three weeks. At the end of the war he was in Gunskirchen and witnessed terrible scenes of cannibalism as a result of the hunger at the camp.
