TAPE I

- 1.00 He was born in Krakow in 1926. Describes his well-to-do family. Father owned flour mills. Family is very religious. He goes to cheder.
- 1.04 Describes Jewish life. Culture. He was 13 when war broke out and refugees started to arrive.
- 1.10 In 1938 his grandfather sold his belongings and went to Palestine but then returned.
- 1.15 Describes Krakow at outbreak of war. Persecution of Jews, kidnappings to work camps.
- 1.22 Family went to village outside Krakow.
- 1.24 Describes incident of cruelty by village butcher.
- 1.30 He worked in the village for one of his grandfather's workers who had taken over the mill.

- 2.05 Works in road building unit under Grossbar.
- 2.09 He and father work in Plaskzow building canals. Describes.
- 2.22 Describes digging pits under supervision of Jewish police into which bus loads of people were shot and buried.
- 2.37 Describes hangings.
- 2.44 They were taken to Plascow and then by truck to Shindler's camp, and then to another camp where he worked in an airplane factory. Difference between Shindler's camp and his.
- 2.52 Daily life and routine in camp.
- 3.10 Describes barracks, kapos and Jewish police.
