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- 1.00 He was born 4/3/30 in Piotrkow. Describes his family. He grew up in Lodz and went to school there.
- 1.08 Sept.1, 1939, beginning of war, his grandfather took him and his mother to Lublin. Describes bombardments.
- 1.12 When German troops arrived they went back to Lodz and then Piotrkow. Describes life in the ghetto in Piotrkow [1st ghetto in Poland].
- 1.23 Oct. 1941 transports started. Describes 'magic' they used to predict the future. Abuses by SS man Wilhelm.
- 1.28 People were taken to work in three factories. Describes his work.
- 1.40 Describes life in ghetto.
- 1.44 Oct. 1942 he remained in work camp near factory. Describes conditions.
- 1.50 Transports to Treblinka started. His parents hid out but were betrayed by Jonah Levin who was a Nazi collaborator. Mother was taken on a transport. Describes scenes on the trains passing by the factory.
- 1.59 He was 12 years old when with his father they found themselves at a factory in the work camp, Bugy (?). It was a wood factory. He describes it.
- 2.09 Summer 1943, Piotrkow was free of Jews. Nov. 1944 the Russian front was approaching and they were taken by train to Czestochowa where adults worked in a weapons factory but the children did not do much. Describes work and conditions. They heard the Russians and thought the war was over, but for them it was not.
- 2.21 Jan. 1945 he is taken by train to Buchenwald where he was separated from his father. Describes arrival, conditions in camp and population.
- 2.27 He is taken to block 66, the children's block. Describes life in the block. Describes Jewish block Alteste, Gustav who took revenge on kapos and collaborators.
- 2.42 April 1945 they were taken to Theresienstadt (Terezin). Describes first the

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- march and then the train ride. Terezin is liberated in May by the Russians. Describes treatment by Russians. He had a cousin there. When the children got better, they were sent as a group to England, but he did not go.
- 3.03 He found out that he had family in Lodz, went there and stayed with an uncle, Yehiel Granatshtein, a writer who had been in the underground. Their meeting was very exciting. He did not find anyone from his family in Piotrokov.
- 3.06 Found out that father was in the DP camp in Feldafing and was reunited with him there. A journalist came from the DP camp with a list of names of survivors among whom was his father who was in a hospital there. He later went to Israel but his father remained in Germany.
- 3.09 Reviews critical times of survival during the war.
