0:00 - Horace Berry born 1920 in Greer, S.C. Attended Greer High School and then Clemson University. One brother and one sister.

1:00 - Entered army in 1941 directly from Clemson which was military school- 2nd Lieutenant.

1:45 - 1945 in 71st Infantry Division. Sweeping operation.

3:03 - In Austria (Lembach) saw inmates on road ; description given.

4:00 - K-Company duties. 10,000 German prisoners.

4:30 - Ordered to camp to bury dead and send live ones to hospital in ^{Wales?} Austria. Hungarian Jews. Everything wood, no fences.

6:00 - SS troops were forced to bury the dead.

7:00 - Description of camp. Awful smell.

9:30 - Went into Lembach and forced citizens to come and see.

10:30 - An artist brought in to sketch conditions of camp.

11:00 - Experience at Dachau. Description of gasing operation.

13:30 - Dogs fed with dead human bodies.

14:30 - Would have been impossible to escape.

16:00 - Discharge from army.
