### 4

00:00:12,510 --> 00:00:16,320 were Jews from Budapest and the provinces.

# 5

00:00:16,320 --> 00:00:23,680 The deportation of Jews was much, much--

### 6

00:00:23,680 --> 00:00:27,420 it was really very, very extensive.

# 7

00:00:27,420 --> 00:00:30,360 And most of the people in the provinces didn't survive.

### 8

00:00:30,360 --> 00:00:33,270 And this was in the province of Miskolc.

# 9

00:00:33,270 --> 00:00:38,010 So very quickly, the school was seized by the local fascists

10 00:00:38,010 --> 00:00:39,390 and the Germans.

### 11

00:00:39,390 --> 00:00:42,480 And most of the kids from that school

# 12

00:00:42,480 --> 00:00:48,090 were sent directly to Auschwitz and killed, including that boy

### 13

00:00:48,090 --> 00:00:51,150 whose father I talked to.

### 14

00:00:51,150 --> 00:00:53,580 And of course, when that happened,

### 15

00:00:53,580 --> 00:00:56,625 suddenly my mother had--

### 16

00:00:56,625 --> 00:00:59,550 become from-- turned from a crazy woman

# 17

00:00:59,550 --> 00:01:04,769 into a great sage who had the foresight

# 18 00:01:04,769 --> 00:01:06,285 to make the right decision.

19 00:01:06,285 --> 00:01:09,190

# 20 00:01:09,190 --> 00:01:12,540 Then what-- so that was--

21 00:01:12,540 --> 00:01:15,330 that phase finished.

# 22

00:01:15,330 --> 00:01:21,510 Then later on, I guess in beginning spring or maybe

# 23

00:01:21,510 --> 00:01:28,170 mid-spring of 1944, I remember I was at a soccer game, 00:01:28,170 --> 00:01:31,800 watching a soccer game with a couple of friends of mine,

#### 25

00:01:31,800 --> 00:01:34,890 when the sister of one of these friends

### 26

00:01:34,890 --> 00:01:38,460 came and told us that we better go home,

### 27

00:01:38,460 --> 00:01:42,730 that they're going to be taking the Jews again.

### 28

00:01:42,730 --> 00:01:46,740 And I got home, and my parents had already

### 29

00:01:46,740 --> 00:01:48,570 heard about that, too.

# 30

00:01:48,570 --> 00:01:50,730 But it was not an official announcement.

# 31

00:01:50,730 --> 00:01:54,460 By this time, the grapevine was pretty good,

# 32

00:01:54,460 --> 00:01:58,380 so that story-- a story like that got out before they

# 33

00:01:58,380 --> 00:02:01,810 intended it to get out.

# 34

00:02:01,810 --> 00:02:06,190 And so then the question became is what are we going to do 00:02:06,190 --> 00:02:09,090 and where are we going to hide?

### 36

00:02:09,090 --> 00:02:13,380 And my parents, I do remember that fairly clearly,

## 37

00:02:13,380 --> 00:02:17,310 talking and trying to think of all the possible alternatives,

### 38

00:02:17,310 --> 00:02:20,580 and deciding finally to approach the president

# 39

00:02:20,580 --> 00:02:25,440 of the Chamber of Commerce who had been so much farther--

# 40

00:02:25,440 --> 00:02:28,530 my father's behalf earlier.

# 41

00:02:28,530 --> 00:02:30,750 And so they approached him about whether we

# 42

00:02:30,750 --> 00:02:34,440 could hide out on his property.

## 43

00:02:34,440 --> 00:02:36,570 And he said, OK.

# 44

00:02:36,570 --> 00:02:39,300 And in fact, he had a one or two other families

# 45

00:02:39,300 --> 00:02:41,640 that he had already arranged to hide.

# 46

00:02:41,640 --> 00:02:43,290 Now, where did the hide us? 47 00:02:43,290 --> 00:02:50,160 In the pigsty-- literally, in a pigsty, and on the ground.

# 48

00:02:50,160 --> 00:02:56,010 And so we stayed there with rats all over the place,

# 49

00:02:56,010 --> 00:03:02,010 and we stayed there for two or three days and nights.

### 50

00:03:02,010 --> 00:03:05,970 And by that time, the--

# 51

00:03:05,970 --> 00:03:08,700 my parents were getting word from this man

# 52

00:03:08,700 --> 00:03:11,250 that he was getting nervous about this whole business,

# 53

00:03:11,250 --> 00:03:14,280 and he wasn't sure how long he could keep us.

# 54

00:03:14,280 --> 00:03:16,680 And then the next day, he told us

# 55

00:03:16,680 --> 00:03:19,680 a new development had taken place.

### 56

00:03:19,680 --> 00:03:27,660 The whole thing has been called off and everybody can come out,

# 57

00:03:27,660 --> 00:03:34,860 and that a deal had been struck with the Jewish leadership that 58 00:03:34,860 --> 00:03:38,310 instead of the Jews being deported,

# 59

00:03:38,310 --> 00:03:43,140 that the Jews from that section of Slovakia, Eastern Slovakia,

### 60

00:03:43,140 --> 00:03:46,068 would be required to move to the west.

### 61

00:03:46,068 --> 00:03:48,360 So for a while, there's a question, do you believe him?

### 62

00:03:48,360 --> 00:03:49,068 Do you trust him?

### 63

00:03:49,068 --> 00:03:50,820 Because trickery had been--

# 64

00:03:50,820 --> 00:03:53,880 or do you-- or do you trust the announcement?

# 65

00:03:53,880 --> 00:03:56,760 Was it that set up so that people

# 66

00:03:56,760 --> 00:03:59,010 would come out of hiding?

# 67

00:03:59,010 --> 00:04:01,290 And then they would catch them all.

# 68

00:04:01,290 --> 00:04:05,340 But they decided to come out, and most people

# 69 00:04:05,340 --> 00:04:07,540

decided to come out, and turned out to be true.

### 70

00:04:07,540 --> 00:04:09,930 And this was an instance where some

### 71

00:04:09,930 --> 00:04:15,070 of the top Jewish leadership did negotiate about the situation.

### 72

00:04:15,070 --> 00:04:19,589 And the reason they decided at that point

# 73

00:04:19,589 --> 00:04:25,530 to try and deport the Jews from that area

# 74

00:04:25,530 --> 00:04:29,640 was because the Russian front was approaching.

# 75

00:04:29,640 --> 00:04:35,520 And so the unreliable Jews had to be gotten rid of.

# 76

00:04:35,520 --> 00:04:40,140 And also, this was a time when the transports from Hungary

# 77

00:04:40,140 --> 00:04:44,290 were going through Slovakia to Auschwitz.

# 78

00:04:44,290 --> 00:04:46,740 So it seemed like a convenient time

# 79

00:04:46,740 --> 00:04:51,390 to hook up a few cars to those trains. 00:04:51,390 --> 00:04:54,210 But the deal was made, and it was true,

### 81

00:04:54,210 --> 00:04:58,850 and everybody had to move to western part of Slovakia,

### 82

00:04:58,850 --> 00:05:02,590 except people who had certain exemptions, even

### 83

00:05:02,590 --> 00:05:09,310 then, like doctors and dentists, pharmacists.

# 84

00:05:09,310 --> 00:05:12,430 They could remain and be exempt.

# 85

00:05:12,430 --> 00:05:16,150 I say-- I mention that because in fact what happened was that

# 86

00:05:16,150 --> 00:05:19,360 later on, those exemptions were no longer valid,

# 87

00:05:19,360 --> 00:05:23,860 and most of those people really did not survive because they

#### 88 00-0

00:05:23,860 --> 00:05:28,870 were so isolated and really hadn't learned--

# 89

00:05:28,870 --> 00:05:31,150 they had been exempt all the way through

# 90

00:05:31,150 --> 00:05:36,740 and they hadn't learned the art of survival. 00:05:36,740 --> 00:05:42,830 So our family moved to a town in western Slovakia,

### 92

00:05:42,830 --> 00:05:44,950 which is called Nitra.

### 93

00:05:44,950 --> 00:05:47,380 And the reason they chose that was

# 94

00:05:47,380 --> 00:05:53,150 because that's where my father's Gentile partner came from.

# 95

00:05:53,150 --> 00:05:55,750 That's where his family still live,

# 96

00:05:55,750 --> 00:05:58,520 and he wanted to go back there.

# 97

00:05:58,520 --> 00:06:03,230 So not only us then, but the part-- and in fact,

# 98

00:06:03,230 --> 00:06:09,880 all the apprentices move together with the shop,

# 99

00:06:09,880 --> 00:06:13,720 because the training still depended on continuing

# 100

00:06:13,720 --> 00:06:15,970 their apprenticeship.

# 101 00:06:15,970 --> 00:06:20,290 And so we all moved to Nitra.

102 00:06:20,290 --> 00:06:24,190 And after a while, we got a place to live. 103 00:06:24,190 --> 00:06:27,050 And this will be-- this is an important part of the story.

104 00:06:27,050 --> 00:06:29,620 My parents found a place to live,

### 105 00:06:29,620 --> 00:06:34,270 but in this kind of a complex, sort

106 00:06:34,270 --> 00:06:38,770 of a little housing complex, that had a--

# 107

00:06:38,770 --> 00:06:43,180 was walled off from the street with a gate through the wall.

#### 108

00:06:43,180 --> 00:06:47,210 Inside, there was a couple of yards.

#### 109

00:06:47,210 --> 00:06:52,150 And on one end of the yard there was a detached very small

110 00:06:52,150 --> 00:06:56,620 house, which is where we lived.

111 00:06:56,620 --> 00:07:01,420 Across from the yard was a larger house,

112 00:07:01,420 --> 00:07:04,960 one section of which there was a big room where

113 00:07:04,960 --> 00:07:10,726 the four apprentices that came with my father lived. 114 00:07:10,726 --> 00:07:15,430 Adjoining them was where a railway conductor's

115 00:07:15,430 --> 00:07:17,510 and his family live.

# 116

00:07:17,510 --> 00:07:22,180 And the apprentices arranged for board

117 00:07:22,180 --> 00:07:25,810 by this railway conductor's wife.

#### 118

00:07:25,810 --> 00:07:28,630 And around the corner and then the other side

#### 119

00:07:28,630 --> 00:07:33,140 of this railway conductor's family was a machine tool shop.

#### 120

00:07:33,140 --> 00:07:36,150 And this was all within one enclosed complex.

121

00:07:36,150 --> 00:07:43,720 Now, the whole place was owned by a woman whose husband

122

00:07:43,720 --> 00:07:49,720 had been a Communist during the first Czechoslovakian Republic.

123

00:07:49,720 --> 00:07:53,950 And he was afraid of persecution for being a Communist.

124 00:07:53,950 --> 00:07:58,360 So when they built this house, they specifically 125 00:07:58,360 --> 00:08:03,730 built it with a hiding place that might be used potentially

# 126 00:08:03,730 --> 00:08:05,350 by him.

## 127

00:08:05,350 --> 00:08:10,150 The hiding place was a space that

### 128 00:08:10,150 --> 00:08:12,850 within the structure of the house

129 00:08:12,850 --> 00:08:18,590 that you could get into from the apprentice's room.

### 130 00:08:18,590 --> 00:08:23,920 There was a kind of a closet that was set into the wall,

### 131

00:08:23,920 --> 00:08:28,390 really, more like a armoire or something like that,

# 132

00:08:28,390 --> 00:08:30,040 set into the wall.

# 133

00:08:30,040 --> 00:08:33,220 And you open it up and it seemed to end

134 00:08:33,220 --> 00:08:34,510 where it ended in the back.

# 135 00:08:34,510 --> 00:08:38,080 But actually, it was a false door

00:08:38,080 --> 00:08:43,900 that if you pushed it aside, you got into this space, which

### 137 00:08:43,900 --> 00:08:45,595 was the hiding space.

138 00:08:45,595 --> 00:08:51,030 Now, in terms of size, it--

# 139 00:08:51,030 --> 00:08:54,260 I suppose I should use feet, maybe you can translate it.

140 00:08:54,260 --> 00:08:57,520 It was about as wide as from here

# 141 00:08:57,520 --> 00:09:01,330 to maybe the other side of your chair that you're sitting on.

142 00:09:01,330 --> 00:09:03,640 That's as wide as it was.

# 143

00:09:03,640 --> 00:09:08,260 In terms of length, it was, say, from this wall

### 144

00:09:08,260 --> 00:09:11,440 down to about the end of the rug there.

### 145

00:09:11,440 --> 00:09:14,560 So it was a relatively small space.

### 146

00:09:14,560 --> 00:09:17,410 It had no access to the outside.

# 147 00:09:17,410 --> 00:09:22,030 The walls were damp with moisture.

148 00:09:22,030 --> 00:09:25,930 At any rate-- but when my parents got this place,

149 00:09:25,930 --> 00:09:28,580 this woman who rented it out and have owned it,

150 00:09:28,580 --> 00:09:33,040 who didn't live there, told them about this hiding place.

151 00:09:33,040 --> 00:09:35,350 And apparently, that railway conductor's family

152 00:09:35,350 --> 00:09:40,420 and his family also knew about this hiding place.

153 00:09:40,420 --> 00:09:42,325 So then what happened was this--

154 00:09:42,325 --> 00:09:46,300

155 00:09:46,300 --> 00:09:49,100 after we'd lived there for a little while,

156 00:09:49,100 --> 00:09:51,970 somebody came and told my parents

157 00:09:51,970 --> 00:09:53,950 that they had heard one of the big shots

158 00:09:53,950 --> 00:09:59,230 in the local fascist guard, obviously drunk, 159 00:09:59,230 --> 00:10:02,920 he started yelling and screaming in the marketplace

160 00:10:02,920 --> 00:10:08,620 about how the day will soon come when he will come to our--

161 00:10:08,620 --> 00:10:13,390 this whole complex and get all of the Jews and communists out.

162 00:10:13,390 --> 00:10:16,750

163 00:10:16,750 --> 00:10:20,320 And when my parents heard this story,

164 00:10:20,320 --> 00:10:24,570 they immediately realized they had to do something about this.

165 00:10:24,570 --> 00:10:28,090 Like you could not afford to have an important person

166 00:10:28,090 --> 00:10:33,410 like that out gunning for you.

167 00:10:33,410 --> 00:10:44,290 So my father went to see him with his partner

168 00:10:44,290 --> 00:10:50,140 and put the idea of somehow buying his goodwill, so

169 00:10:50,140 --> 00:10:52,600 gifts or bribe.

170 00:10:52,600 --> 00:10:58,070 And the man wouldn't hear anything of it.

## 171 00:10:58,070 --> 00:10:59,800 And apparently, what was clear was

172 00:10:59,800 --> 00:11:03,040 that he had some grudge against the woman who

173 00:11:03,040 --> 00:11:05,050 owned this place, that he had--

174 00:11:05,050 --> 00:11:09,430 he felt she had cheated him out some years before or something,

# 175 00:11:09,430 --> 00:11:13,720 and he was still holding a bitter grudge against her.

176 00:11:13,720 --> 00:11:18,880 So when my father's partner came back,

#### 177 00:11:18,880 --> 00:11:22,870 my mother, who was sort of ca

my mother, who was sort of canny in these ways said to my father

178 00:11:22,870 --> 00:11:24,820 that he ought to go back by himself,

179 00:11:24,820 --> 00:11:27,630 that the reason the man didn't take a bribe

180 00:11:27,630 --> 00:11:31,270 was that he didn't want a witness there.

181 00:11:31,270 --> 00:11:34,240 Contact reference@ushmm.org for further information about this collection

And so my father did go back.

182 00:11:34,240 --> 00:11:39,640 And my father was very charming and engaging, and by--

183 00:11:39,640 --> 00:11:42,100 and listened to his complaints about this woman.

184 00:11:42,100 --> 00:11:44,380 And said, yes, you're absolutely right.

185 00:11:44,380 --> 00:11:48,580 And then offered him a couple of rings.

186 00:11:48,580 --> 00:11:51,730 And by the time my father left, he

187 00:11:51,730 --> 00:11:54,490 was as friendly as he could be towards my father.

188 00:11:54,490 --> 00:11:57,850 Now, that's supposed to be important because he

189 00:11:57,850 --> 00:12:00,290 appears again in the scene.

190 00:12:00,290 --> 00:12:02,780 The other thing that's important is this.

191 00:12:02,780 --> 00:12:04,640 And here again, my father-- my mother

192 00:12:04,640 --> 00:12:07,750 was really very determined survivor.

#### 193

00:12:07,750 --> 00:12:12,070 And what happened was when we moved to western Slovakia,

### 194 00:12:12,070 --> 00:12:14,410 of course, all Jews who had moved over there

### 195

00:12:14,410 --> 00:12:18,040 were required to register.

#### 196

00:12:18,040 --> 00:12:23,290 And there would be a very severe penalty

### 197

00:12:23,290 --> 00:12:26,350 for those failing to register.

### 198

00:12:26,350 --> 00:12:29,590 Now, my parents had learned already

### 199

00:12:29,590 --> 00:12:33,310 from the previous experience that certainly the police

#### 200

00:12:33,310 --> 00:12:35,740 followed the registration list, and then they

# 201

00:12:35,740 --> 00:12:38,620 went to pick up the Jews.

#### 202

00:12:38,620 --> 00:12:41,020 So my mother was determined that we were not

#### 203 00:12:41.02

00:12:41,020 --> 00:12:43,760 going to register, period.

00:12:43,760 --> 00:12:47,920 But there was such a pressure from everybody to go along,

#### 205

00:12:47,920 --> 00:12:51,850 not to cause trouble, that one day there

#### 206

00:12:51,850 --> 00:12:53,470 was this area where a lot of-- there

#### 207

00:12:53,470 --> 00:12:57,820 was a Jewish soup kitchen and school, and so on.

#### 208

00:12:57,820 --> 00:12:59,780 And that's where the registration took place.

#### 209

00:12:59,780 --> 00:13:03,517 There was-- one day my mother saw my father in line

#### 210

00:13:03,517 --> 00:13:06,780 to register, and she made a big stink.

#### 211

00:13:06,780 --> 00:13:08,700 And he finally stepped out of the line

#### 212

00:13:08,700 --> 00:13:12,000 and we didn't register.

# 213 00:13:12,000 --> 00:13:15,750

Which probably also helped, because what happened

214 00:13:15,750 --> 00:13:16,320 was that--

215 00:13:16,320 --> 00:13:18,828 216 00:13:18,828 --> 00:13:20,610 again, this is part of history.

217 00:13:20,610 --> 00:13:25,060 There was this-- the Slovak resistance suddenly erupted,

218 00:13:25,060 --> 00:13:29,190 and the Germans marched and came in

219 00:13:29,190 --> 00:13:35,160 and took a much more direct role in the governing

220 00:13:35,160 --> 00:13:37,110 of the country.

221 00:13:37,110 --> 00:13:39,390 And also came to fight off the resistance,

222 00:13:39,390 --> 00:13:41,520 because suddenly, the resistance was--

223 00:13:41,520 --> 00:13:44,680 had taken over a fairly big chunk of territory,

224 00:13:44,680 --> 00:13:48,400 but not the town where we were.

225 00:13:48,400 --> 00:13:53,250 And-- so but people knew things were going to get bad.

226 00:13:53,250 --> 00:13:57,360 Now, the first day that my sister and I Contact reference@ushmm.org for further information about this collection

227 00:13:57,360 --> 00:14:02,130 were supposed to start up in school, September of 1944,

228 00:14:02,130 --> 00:14:06,060 we were late for school.

229 00:14:06

00:14:06,060 --> 00:14:09,390 Suddenly, my father comes back, having already left

230

00:14:09,390 --> 00:14:13,360 to go to work, and in a panic.

231 00:14:13,360 --> 00:14:15,450 He'd apparently stopped off at the barber.

232 00:14:15,450 --> 00:14:17,372 Barber started lathering his face

233 00:14:17,372 --> 00:14:19,830 and then told him about the Jews-- they're taking the Jews.

234 00:14:19,830 --> 00:14:22,440 And my father said, take the soap, lather up.

235 00:14:22,440 --> 00:14:24,300 He came right back.

236 00:14:24,300 --> 00:14:32,220 But, hey, if we hadn't heard about this police big shot

237 00:14:32,220 --> 00:14:36,720 being after us, he would have been there at 6:00 that morning

238 00:14:36,720 --> 00:14:40,290 to get us and-- if my father hadn't

### 239 00:14:40,290 --> 00:14:44,640 succeeded in winning him over.

240 00:14:44,640 --> 00:14:47,580 And if we had registered, they probably

### 241

00:14:47,580 --> 00:14:51,560 would have been there fairly early, too.

#### 242

00:14:51,560 --> 00:14:55,620 In fact, they never came to pick us up officially,

#### 243

00:14:55,620 --> 00:14:59,910 because we were not on the registration list.

# 244

00:14:59,910 --> 00:15:05,950 So-- but when we-- my father come back, what to do,

### 245

00:15:05,950 --> 00:15:07,690 where to go.

#### 246

00:15:07,690 --> 00:15:10,380 And for some reason, I guess my parents really didn't quite

#### 247

00:15:10,380 --> 00:15:10,980 trust--

#### 248

00:15:10,980 --> 00:15:13,710 although, this railway conductor not long

### 249

00:15:13,710 --> 00:15:16,710 before I told my father, Henry, don't worry, 250 00:15:16,710 --> 00:15:19,480 tribal council will hide you.

251 00:15:19,480 --> 00:15:22,260 They, I guess, didn't trust it because their decision was

#### 252

00:15:22,260 --> 00:15:29,910 that we would go to the house of my father's partner's parents.

253 00:15:29,910 --> 00:15:32,760 And they had a house on the other side of town,

#### 254

00:15:32,760 --> 00:15:37,060 on the outskirts, with some orchards and so on.

#### 255

00:15:37,060 --> 00:15:39,270 So again, we broke up into three groups.

#### 256

00:15:39,270 --> 00:15:42,820 My sister and I and my father along and my mother

#### 257

00:15:42,820 --> 00:15:46,170 along to make the journey across the town.

#### 258

00:15:46,170 --> 00:15:50,160 And I do remember that because everywhere you saw police cars

#### 259

00:15:50,160 --> 00:15:52,490 and they were picking up Jews everywhere.

260 00:15:52,490 --> 00:15:55,170 One time, it seemed to me, at least, 261 00:15:55,170 --> 00:15:57,960 like the policemen in the car looked at us for a while

262 00:15:57,960 --> 00:16:00,510 before he decided to go on.

263 00:16:00,510 --> 00:16:06,540 We finally all got there, and they put us--

264 00:16:06,540 --> 00:16:09,720 these people agreed to hide us, and they put us

265 00:16:09,720 --> 00:16:14,160 in an open kind of shed in their orchard.

266 00:16:14,160 --> 00:16:15,810 And that night was miserable.

267 00:16:15,810 --> 00:16:21,660 It was cold, and we kept hearing noise of people going--

268 00:16:21,660 --> 00:16:24,960 obviously, being in the woods and coming closer and closer

269 00:16:24,960 --> 00:16:27,300 and branches crackling.

270 00:16:27,300 --> 00:16:31,590 Finally, totally panicked by it, made them--

271 00:16:31,590 --> 00:16:33,300 these people take us inside.

272 00:16:33,300 --> 00:16:37,170 We heard later on that there had been thieves in the orchard

### 273

00:16:37,170 --> 00:16:39,570 all night, and that's what we were hearing.

### 274

00:16:39,570 --> 00:16:41,400 We stayed there for a couple of days--

### 275

00:16:41,400 --> 00:16:43,680 two or three days.

### 276

00:16:43,680 --> 00:16:47,340 And then these people said, we can't keep you anymore.

### 277

00:16:47,340 --> 00:16:51,180 We're afraid of what will happen to us.

# 278 00:16:51,180 --> 00:16:54,120 We've got an idea for you--

#### 279

00:16:54,120 --> 00:16:55,030 place to hide.

### 280 00:16:55,030 --> 00:16:56,340 We know of this place.

# 281 00:16:56,340 --> 00:16:57,270 They're in an attic.

# 282 00:16:57,270 --> 00:16:58,740 There are 24 people.

283 00:16:58,740 --> 00:17:01,140 I'm sure they'll take you, too.

# 284 00:17:01,140 --> 00:17:03,990 And here again, my parents,

particularly my mother's

## 285 00:17:03,990 --> 00:17:07,962 response is, I'm not going there.

286 00:17:07,962 --> 00:17:11,880 If you know about this place and you have no business knowing

# 287 00:17:11,880 --> 00:17:14,369 about that hiding place, that place

### 288 00:17:14,369 --> 00:17:18,930 isn't going to be good for very long at all.

298 00:17:55,510 --> 00:18:01,900 and said, look, we want to hide out in this hiding place.

299 00:18:01,900 --> 00:18:04,570 And he his family had to be involved

300 00:18:04,570 --> 00:18:07,810 because we had to be fed, aside from the fact

301 00:18:07,810 --> 00:18:09,200 that we knew about the place.

302 00:18:09,200 --> 00:18:14,200 And so he said, no way.

303 00:18:14,200 --> 00:18:17,360 And there was pleading back and forth,

304 00:18:17,360 --> 00:18:20,170 but he was adamant-- no way.

305 00:18:20,170 --> 00:18:23,320 And then at some point, he goes off

306 00:18:23,320 --> 00:18:26,185 for a walk with his seven-year-old daughter.

### 308 00:18:29,110 --> 00:18:33,760 And this was one time where I really

309 00:18:33,760 --> 00:18:37,570 did feel everything was lost and my parents just had

# 311

00:18:41,120 --> 00:18:46,720 And we're waiting at any time for a knock

# 312

00:18:46,720 --> 00:18:51,430 to come on the gate, and that was it.

00:18:51,430 --> 00:18:54,010 At some point, we hear a knock on the door, which is the gate

00:18:54,010 --> 00:18:57,130 hadn't opened and we pretty sure it wasn't the police,

### 315

00:18:57,130 --> 00:19:00,160 and it was one of the apprentices.

00:19:00,160 --> 00:19:06,235 And he told us, why don't you come into that hiding place?

### 317 00:19:06,235 --> 00:19:08,970 We'll hide you.

329 00:19:42,520 --> 00:19:45,790 there was no way that-- that wasn't going to work, either.

#### 332

#### 334

00:20:19,940 --> 00:20:20,440 Yeah.

### 344

00:20:20,440 --> 00:20:26,740 So then-- but-- and partly, they agreed, I think.

### 345

00:20:26,740 --> 00:20:28,503 I mean, probably they did feel for us

# 346

00:20:28,503 --> 00:20:29,920 and so on, and there was certainly

00:20:29,920 --> 00:20:33,730 some charitable feeling involved.

# 348

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were in that hiding place

# 354

00:20:52,960 --> 00:21:00,200 without ever budging from that place for two full months.

### 355

00:21:00,200 --> 00:21:05,140 We were mostly all lying down to be

### 356

00:21:05,140 --> 00:21:09,490 able to fit in to that place.

### 357

00:21:09,490 --> 00:21:13,090 The woman would bring us the food in the laundry basket

### 358

00:21:13,090 --> 00:21:14,410 and so on that--

#### 359 00·21·14 410 --> 00·21·17

00:21:14,410 --> 00:21:17,140

# 360

00:21:17,140 --> 00:21:19,900 and of course, it wasn't kosher food.

### 361

00:21:19,900 --> 00:21:22,030 It was pretty good that first day,

### 362

00:21:22,030 --> 00:21:26,350 and it was OK to eat it because you have to.

00:21:26,350 --> 00:21:33,400 And then in terms of our elimination functions,

374 00:22:08,530 --> 00:22:10,840 at some point and thinking that was-- that meant

375 00:22:10,840 --> 00:22:12,520 I was really going to die.

376 00:22:12,520 --> 00:22:14,990 I didn't know that meant Contact reference@ushmm.org for further information about this collection

my fever was breaking.

### 377

00:22:14,990 --> 00:22:17,230 And it was after they had sent one of the apprentices

### 378

00:22:17,230 --> 00:22:19,870 out to get some kind of anti-fever medication.

### 390 00:22:58,090 --> 00:23:00,610 And for the next period of time-- and now,

391 00:23:00,610 --> 00:23:01,690 this was after--

392 00:23:01,690 --> 00:23:04,150 this-- I mean, the total time we were in that hiding

### 393 00:23:04,150 --> 00:23:04,915 was nine months.

394 00:23:04,915 --> 00:23:07,600

# 395 00:23:07,600 --> 00:23:09,820 But during-- there was a period of time

396 00:23:09,820 --> 00:23:12,070 there where we would then, particularly if the railway

397 00:23:12,070 --> 00:23:14,890 conductor and the fact that he was away most of the time,

408 00:23:50,590 --> 00:23:52,780 that pretty soon the Germans were

409 00:23:52,780 --> 00:23:56,860 going to conscript able-bodied Gentile

410 00:23:56,860 --> 00:24:04,930 Slovakians for labor in Germany to help with the war effort. 411 00:24:04,930 --> 00:24:07,360 And he certainly didn't want that.

412 00:24:07,360 --> 00:24:10,720 So he wanted to be able to use the hiding place for himself,

413 00:24:10,720 --> 00:24:12,620 if necessary.

414 00:24:12,620 --> 00:24:13,930 So he asked us to leave.

415 00:24:13,930 --> 00:24:16,450

416 00:24:16,450 --> 00:24:25,180 And at that point, my parents said to him, OK, George, we'll

417 00:24:25,180 --> 00:24:27,730 go, but you know very well they're

418 00:24:27,730 --> 00:24:30,370 going to catch us very quickly.

419 00:24:30,370 --> 00:24:35,776 And I'm sure they'll ask us, where were you?

420 00:24:35,776 --> 00:24:38,020 And we'll tell them.

421 00:24:38,020 --> 00:24:41,890 I mean, aside of course, from the possible punishment

422 00:24:41,890 --> 00:24:44,380 for hiding, which really never-- 423 00:24:44,380 --> 00:24:46,180 there was always threatened, but I never

## 424 00:24:46,180 --> 00:24:49,700 heard of anybody who really got shot or anything like that

425 00:24:49,700 --> 00:24:51,460 for hiding Jews.

426 00:24:51,460 --> 00:24:54,190 But the hiding place was no good.

## 427

00:24:54,190 --> 00:24:57,050 If the officials knew, it wouldn't be any good for him,

## 428

00:24:57,050 --> 00:25:01,825 so there was no reason for him then to pay off and his asking.

429

00:25:01,825 --> 00:25:04,450

## 430

00:25:04,450 --> 00:25:09,010 That in itself-- and for a while then, occasionally at night,

431 00:25:09,010 --> 00:25:11,650 we would actually go out in the yard for a walk.

432

 $00:25:11,650 \rightarrow 00:25:14,270$ And I remember the first time the fresh air.

433 00:25:14,270 --> 00:25:16,210 I hadn't seen for months.

#### 435

00:25:20,020 --> 00:25:26,650 But then one day, the German army moved into that complex.

## 436

00:25:26,650 --> 00:25:31,460 They took over the place where we had lived.

#### 437

00:25:31,460 --> 00:25:34,780 And there was a leather shop they made there.

## 438

00:25:34,780 --> 00:25:37,990 They took over the machine tool shop,

## 439

00:25:37,990 --> 00:25:41,710 and had some other kind of shop.

## 440

00:25:41,710 --> 00:25:45,310 And the whole yard was patrolled by a German sentry

#### 441

#### 442

00:25:47,750 --> 00:25:50,260 So there was no way, obviously, we

#### 443

00:25:50,260 --> 00:25:52,420 could ever go out of that room.

#### 444

00:25:52,420 --> 00:25:56,080 And that room had a kind of a porch between itself

#### 445

00:25:56,080 --> 00:25:59,090 and the yard, but you could see through the windows. 446

447 00:25:59,590 --> 00:26:00,908 There-- was there any light?

448

00:26:02,200 --> 00:26:04,450 Very little light in that room, because what

450 00:26:04,450 --> 00:26:07,780 you had was certainly no light in the hiding place

451 00:26:07,780 --> 00:26:11,230 at all other than from a candle, and no electric light.

452 00:26:11,230 --> 00:26:15,050 And then there was room which was relatively dark,

453 00:26:15,050 --> 00:26:16,750 because there was, in fact, a porch--

454 00:26:16,750 --> 00:26:20,200 not a screen porch, it was a glass enclosed porch

455 00:26:20,200 --> 00:26:21,910 beyond that.

456 00:26:21,910 --> 00:26:28,630 And there was a little window between the room and the glass

457 00:26:28,630 --> 00:26:30,850 enclosed porch, as well as, I think,

## 458

00:26:30,850 --> 00:26:32,878 some glass on the door that let--

## 459

00:26:32,878 --> 00:26:34,420 but you could see through the window.

## 460

00:26:34,420 --> 00:26:37,000 You could see the German sentry out there.

## 461 00:26:37,000 --> 00:26:40,630 And one time in the evening, one of the apprentices

# 462

00:26:40,630 --> 00:26:44,380 was on his way from the other conductor's house

## 463 00:26:44,380 --> 00:26:48,400 from his meal back to the place, and the German sentry said,

## 464 00:26:48,400 --> 00:26:50,800 halt. And he got panicked and kept running

465 00:26:50,800 --> 00:26:52,870 towards the room where we were.

## 466

00:26:52,870 --> 00:26:55,510 Finally, stopped at the door step.

## 467 00:26:55,510 --> 00:26:58,780 But he could have walked right in.

So then what happened was that--

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480 00:27:49,880 --> 00:27:54,590 But really, the front stalled for the winter about 35 miles,

481 00:27:54,590 --> 00:27:57,890 40 miles from where we were.

00:27:57,890 --> 00:28:04,370 And then one day, there were sirens and planes

00:28:04,370 --> 00:28:08,060 all over the place, and a big bombing attack took place.

00:28:08,060 --> 00:28:10,610 Before that, there had been air raids of American flying

00:28:10,610 --> 00:28:14,420 fortresses that kept flying over to Viennese Neustadt

00:28:14,420 --> 00:28:16,790 to bomb the armaments factories there.

00:28:16,790 --> 00:28:18,350 And we've gotten used to the fact

488

00:28:18,350 --> 00:28:21,980 that nothing ever happened there.

489 00:28:21,980 --> 00:28:24,450 But this time was different-- low flying planes

490 00:28:24,450 --> 00:28:27,080 and suddenly we were being bombed. 491 00:28:27,080 --> 00:28:29,580 And there was no basement we could go to,

492 00:28:29,580 --> 00:28:33,110 and windows were all broken.

493

00:28:33,110 --> 00:28:38,960 And-- but that was the start of the Russian offense that--

494

00:28:38,960 --> 00:28:45,080 where the front had been stalled for all of that time.

495

00:28:45,080 --> 00:28:49,580 And then the question was-- and at that point,

496

00:28:49,580 --> 00:28:52,160 this is what happened.

497 00:28:52,160 --> 00:28:54,230 We can no longer hide from the railway conductor

498 00:28:54,230 --> 00:28:56,510 that we were--

499 00:28:56,510 --> 00:28:59,420 and of course, with the war about to be over,

500 00:28:59,420 --> 00:29:04,280 he had no more objection to our being there because--

501 00:29:04,280 --> 00:29:07,130 one of the things, the propaganda, German propaganda

502 00:29:07,130 --> 00:29:08,570 was very--

503

00:29:08,570 --> 00:29:11,270 would have you believe that when they came in,

504 00:29:11,270 --> 00:29:14,720 whatever Jews were left would become kings.

505 00:29:14,720 --> 00:29:18,050

And anybody who had anything to do against them

506 00:29:18,050 --> 00:29:20,120 would be severely punished.

507

00:29:20,120 --> 00:29:24,470 And I guess it was to keep the motivation on their side,

508 00:29:24,470 --> 00:29:26,960 because a lot of people were in some way implicated,

509

00:29:26,960 --> 00:29:29,750 even though, I think, people had taken over Jewish property

510 00:29:29,750 --> 00:29:32,640 and so on and so forth.

511 00:29:32,640 --> 00:29:34,220 So-- but by that point, everybody

512 00:29:34,220 --> 00:29:37,380 was looking to have a good deed on their side.

513 00:29:37,380 --> 00:29:40,990 514 00:29:40,990 --> 00:29:43,370 So we were-- so at some point, particularly

## 515 00:29:43,370 --> 00:29:46,220 after the second night when the front started,

516 00:29:46,220 --> 00:29:51,110 it was shelling all night.

## 517 00:29:51,110 --> 00:29:55,220 Big flares of light and big explosion,

518 00:29:55,220 --> 00:29:57,510 and there was nowhere to hide.

## 519 00:29:57,510 --> 00:30:02,540 So at some point, my parents decided to go.

520 00:30:02,540 --> 00:30:04,990 And the other people, the railway conductor

## 521 00:30:04,990 --> 00:30:09,560 and the other apprentices went to the railway conductor's

522 00:30:09,560 --> 00:30:12,180 new house, which had a basement, which

523 00:30:12,180 --> 00:30:14,420 is about a mile or so away.

524 00:30:14,420 --> 00:30:18,230 And at some point, we decided to join them.

But when we got there, then we started hearing stories

## 552

## 553

00:31:49,790 --> 00:31:53,630 and came out into the open, my parents

## 554 00:31:53,630 --> 00:31:57,620 felt what if there is a counterattack and we were not--

## 555

00:31:57,620 --> 00:32:01,940 and Germans temporarily retake this place?

# 556

00:32:01,940 --> 00:32:05,180 So they wanted to find some way of moving

## 557 00:32:05,180 --> 00:32:08,000 further back behind the lines.

558 00:32:08,000 --> 00:32:12,920 Having believed all of this German propaganda about how

559 00:32:12,920 --> 00:32:16,820 when the Russians came in, they were so wonderful to the Jews,

560 00:32:16,820 --> 00:32:21,440 my father set out to the Russian headquarters

561 00:32:21,440 --> 00:32:25,280 to find out if it's possible to be transported

562 00:32:25,280 --> 00:32:28,070 back further behind the line.

563 00:32:28,070 --> 00:32:31,310 He runs into a couple of Russian soldiers

564 00:32:31,310 --> 00:32:34,300 and asks, where is the headquarters?

565 00:32:34,300 --> 00:32:37,200 And they ask him, who are you?

566 00:32:37,200 --> 00:32:38,750 Why are you asking?

567 00:32:38,750 --> 00:32:43,190 And my father says, well, I'm Jewish, expecting then

568 00:32:43,190 --> 00:32:45,440 to be treated royally.

569 00:32:45,440 --> 00:32:49,940 And that one of the soldiers, they were both pretty drunk,

570 00:32:49,940 --> 00:32:54,410 points his automatic gun at him and said, you're Jewish? 571 00:32:54,410 --> 00:32:57,330 I'm going to kill you.

#### 572

00:32:57,330 --> 00:33:00,030 And could easily have done that on the first day

#### 573

00:33:00,030 --> 00:33:01,680 after the-- yeah.

#### 574

00:33:01,680 --> 00:33:02,760 Oh, God.

#### 575

00:33:02,760 --> 00:33:07,830 And his buddy said, ah, let him go.

#### 576

00:33:07,830 --> 00:33:12,360 My father no longer looked for the headquarters but came back.

We kept our fingers crossed, and of course, there
