Summary:

David Yegher describes his life in Romania pre World War II; early institutionalized Anti-Semitism throughout Europe; his displacement in a ghetto in Czechoslovakia; transporting goods from nearby towns to Jewish families in the ghetto; his experiences in Auschwitz and Gleiwitz and subsequent hardships in the labor camps; being liberated by the British Army; his post-war hospitalization; immigrating to the United States; his encounter with the American Nazi Party; and the importance of trying to overcome contemporary Anti-Semitism.
