She was born Margot Friedlander in Berlin in 1931.

Her parents were taken away in early 1942 by the Gestapo because they apparently hid Polish Jews, leaving her and two younger brothers alone. They were taken to a transitional small camp in Berlin, with 80 other children, worked in assorted jobs.

They were liberated by the Russians as the war ended. She and her brothers were taken by a communist aunt. A friend influenced her to go to Palestine. So she escaped with her brothers from her aunt, met Jewish Brigade soldiers in Berlin who sent them to Bergen-Belsen and Blankensee.

After less than a year they were sent to Palestine and joined Kibbutz Dorot. She describes the work she has been doing in the kibbutz since then.
