SUMMARY

Diane Millman is the child of survivor, Edith Millman, born in Bielsko, Poland in 1924. Diane details her personal experience as the daughter of a survivor. Diane's mother is a Warsaw Ghetto survivor. Diane's mother and maternal grandparents survived the war; see Edith Millman's interview (#GC00360; RG-50.462.0043).

Diane discusses how she always knew about her mother's experiences and describes the ramification for her life as a youngster: feelings of guilt, weight of mother's expectations, rebellious against over-protective tendencies, difficulties in understanding each other's point of view and feeling a need to compensate for what her mother missed (career). She questions now why she didn't understand her mother more when she was younger. Diane also discusses her feelings about Judaism and Israel.
