This was in April of 1945. The date I have in my album is April 4. The figure on the left side belongs to that of the Lieutenant Bernard Smith, who was a observer pilot. He flew a Piper Cub plane. Considered quite brave, won the Silver Star. The person on the right is me.

And we're-- it says in my notation in my album-- standing on a German gun mount on the German Autobahn near Waltershausen in Germany, which is 3 miles west of Ohrdruf where we found the concentration camp. The Germans had planned to, I've learned since the war was over, build a redoubt for their military headquarters in this general area and pull out of Berlin and fight on the war from this area. So they had a pretty well ringed with armament.
