- Q. HOW DID THAT MANIFEST ITSELF IN YOUR RELATIONSHIPS IN YOUR FAMILY AND WITH PEOPLE IN YOUR TOWN? WHAT WAS YOUR FAMILY RELATIONSHIP LIKE?
- A. WELL, I WISH YOU WOULD SORT OF ELABORATE ON THE QUESTION. RELATIONSHIPS IS A VERY WIDE CONCEPT.

 I -- YOU MEAN AT THE TIME, AT WHAT AGE, AND WHEN? I MEAN WHEN I WAS FIVE, SIX OR SEVEN?
- Q. YOU CAN START AS EARLY AS YOU LIKE AND TALK ABOUT THE PROGRESSION.
- A. WELL, THE TOWN I COME FROM IS -- ACTUALLY
 WAS A VERY SMALL TOWN; WAS 7,000 INHABITANTS. AND I

 DON'T HAVE -- JUST GLIMPSES; I DON'T HAVE A VERY GOOD
 RECOLLECTION OF WHAT WAS GOING ON. BUT MY FATHER WAS IN
 THE LUMBER BUSINESS AND WE HAD DOGS AND HE WAS A HUNTER,
 AND IT WAS SORT OF AN OUTDOOR-TYPE LIFE, WHICH I
 ENJOYED, AND WHICH I SORT OF ENJOY UNTIL TODAY. I LIKE
 TO GO INTO THE WOODS AND I HAVE HUNTING DOGS MYSELF.

AND I WAS NOT A VERY GOOD STUDENT, AS I MENTIONED ON THE EARLIER TAPE. I WASN'T -- YOU ASKED ME WHAT KIND OF A CHILD I WAS. I WAS NOT A TROUBLEMAKER OR ANYTHING LIKE THAT.

I WAS A LITTLE BIT OF A MAMA'S BOY. MAYBE

IF I COULD CHANGE ANYTHING, GOING BACK, THAT'S SOMETHING

I WOULD HAVE CHANGED. AND I DON'T KNOW WHAT I CAN TELL

YOU ON THAT. I MEAN IT'S SOMETHING THAT I HAVE NOT, YOU KNOW, CROSSED MY MIND, SO I DON'T KNOW. MAYBE A PAUSE ON CAMERA AND LET ME THINK AND THINK A LOT ABOUT THAT.

MAYBE AS WE GO ALONG, MAYBE IT WILL -- A
PICTURE WILL COME UP IN MY HEAD OF HOW I WAS OR WHAT I
USED TO DO. AS I SAID, MY FATHER WAS IN THE LUMBER
BUSINESS AND IT -- HIS LUMBERYARD WAS RIGHT ACROSS FROM
OUR HOUSE. AND I USED TO PLAY AND BUILD FORTS, AND IT
WAS A SORT OF A CAREFREE LIFE EVEN FOR A CHILD.

COMPARING TO, YOU KNOW, MY CHILDREN AND I

ABOUT THE AGE WHAT I WAS THEN, AND IT IS JUST LIKE

CENTURIES WOULD SEPARATE THE TYPE OF LIFE WE LED AND THE

CHILDREN -- THE TYPE OF LIFE THE CHILDREN LEAD TODAY

HERE IN THIS COUNTRY, AT LEAST IN THIS AREA.

- Q. HOW EXACTLY? WHAT DOES THAT MEAN, THAT
 YOUR LIFE WAS VERY CAREFREE, AND WHEN DID IT START TO
 CHANGE?
- A. WELL, OBVIOUSLY IT STARTED TO CHANGE AFTER

 1939 WHEN THE GERMANS MARCHED INTO CZECHOSLOVAKIA. EVEN

 THEN, YOU KNOW, AS I HAVE MENTIONED -- I WATCHED THE

 TAPE -- THAT BECAUSE OF MY YOUNG AGE, I DIDN'T

 UNDERSTAND THE GRAVITY OF THE SITUATION.

BUT I, YOU KNOW, I SAW AROUND ME, YOU KNOW,
MY FATHER LOSE HIS BUSINESS. WE WERE EVICTED FROM OUR

- 2 | HOUSE; HAD TO MOVE SOMEWHERE ELSE; THE PRESENCE OF
- 3 GESTAPO AND THE HARASSMENT. SO I UNDERSTOOD IT BUT I
- 4 | STILL WAS A CHILD AND I CERTAINLY DIDN'T PERCEIVE IT THE
- 5 | SAME AS THE ADULTS DID. SO THAT'S WHEN IT CHANGED,
- 6 1939. I WAS TEN THEN.

RESPOND TO YOUR QUESTION.

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- Q. WHAT DID THE ADULTS TELL YOU ABOUT IT OR

 8 WHAT DID YOU OVERHEAR THEM TALKING ABOUT?
- A. YOU'RE VERY DEMANDING. IT'S NOTHING THAT

 THEY SAID. ALL I CAN THINK OF -- OR WHAT I SAW, I DON'T

 REMEMBER ANYTHING THAT HAS BEEN SAID. I CAN'T REALLY
 - Q. DID YOU ASK QUESTIONS? DO YOU REMEMBER
 HAVING A CONVERSATION WITH EITHER YOUR MOTHER OR YOUR
 FATHER, SAY, EVEN ON THE LEVEL OF, "WHY DO WE HAVE TO
 MOVE NOW"?
 - A. WELL, NO, I -- WELL, ACTUALLY I KNEW IT.

 AND I DON'T THINK THAT CHILDREN, AT LEAST MYSELF AT THE

 TIME, WERE AS MATURE AS CHILDREN ARE TODAY, YOU KNOW. I

 MIGHT HAVE SOUNDED CRITICAL THE WAY CHILDREN ARE TODAY,

 BUT CHILDREN ARE MUCH MORE -- YOU KNOW, WE LIVE IN A

 DIFFERENT AGE. THEY KNOW MORE.
- AND PERHAPS MY DAUGHTER WOULD ASK

 QUESTIONS, WHICH SHE DOES. I HAVE A TEN-YEAR-OLD

 DAUGHTER. AND I DIDN'T THEN. IT WAS JUST -- AT LEAST I

DON'T REMEMBER ASKING ANY QUESTIONS. I KNEW WE HAD TO MOVE AND I JUST DIDN'T ASK. MAYBE IN MY OWN WAY I UNDERSTOOD WHY.

- Q. WERE THERE OTHER THINGS THAT YOU CAME TO UNDERSTAND JUST BY WATCHING THAT WERE DIFFERENT? YOU MENTIONED THE PRESENCE OF THE GESTAPO AND YOU USED THE WORD "HARASSMENT." WHAT DID YOU SEE OR WHAT DID YOU FEEL THAT YOU --
- A. YOU MEAN WHAT I ACTUALLY SEE? WELL, WE HAD TO -- WHEN WE WERE EVICTED FROM OUR HOUSE AND WE MOVED INTO A BUILDING, THE PICTURE THAT I BROUGHT THAT I HAVE HERE, WE WERE NOT ALLOWED TO GO OUT PAST 8:00 P.M. AND EVEN THEN SOMETIMES THE GESTAPO WAS WALKING AROUND THE STREETS. AND IF THEY SAW ANYBODY JUST STANDING IN THE DOOR, THEY ARRESTED THEM. AND IT WAS A SMALL TOWN, VERY SMALL COMMUNITY. YOU KNEW WHO WAS ARRESTED. AND SOME OF THE PEOPLE WERE EVEN EXECUTED FOR THAT.

I JUST CAME BACK FROM CZECHOSLOVAKIA, FROM
MY HOMETOWN, JUST A FEW WEEKS AGO, AND I WENT TO THE
OLD -- WELL, ACTUALLY IT'S THE JEWISH CEMETERY. IT'S
STILL THERE, AND THERE IS A PLAQUE OF THE PEOPLE OF THE
TOWN THAT WERE JUST GASSED AND DIED AND THOSE PEOPLE WHO
WERE EXECUTED.

AND I JUST -- THIS TIME I WAS BY MYSELF,

WITHOUT MY FAMILY, SO I HAD SORT OF -- WAS ABLE TO MORE FOCUS ON WHAT WAS HAPPENING. BECAUSE AS I HAVE SAID IN MY PREVIOUS INTERVIEW, I HAVE REALLY NOT DWELLED TERRIBLY MUCH ON MY WARTIME EXPERIENCES.

I HAVE FRIENDS WHO DO THAT, PEOPLE THAT

WERE WITH ME IN THE CAMP. IN FACT, I EVEN MET SOME

PEOPLE NOW THAT WERE WITH ME IN THERESIEN DURING THE

WAR. I MADE A POINT TO VISIT SOME OF THE PEOPLE THAT I

HAVEN'T SEEN SINCE 1943. AND THAT WAS SORT OF EXCITING.

BUT THEN AGAIN WE TALKED OF THE PRESENT AND WE TALKED OF WHAT IS HAPPENING IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA RATHER THAN WHAT WE HAVE LIVED THROUGH AT THE TIME, WHICH I WAS THEN 14. YOU KNOW, THEY WERE 14, 15. AND NOT EVEN THEM ARE DWELLING VERY MUCH ON WHAT WAS HAPPENING.

I KNOW I'M DIGRESSING A LITTLE BIT FROM

YOUR QUESTION, BUT IT'S VERY DIFFICULT FOR ME BECAUSE I

DID NOT -- YOU KNOW, I DID NOT, AS I SAID, DWELL ON IT

TERRIBLY MUCH.

YOU KNOW, I HAVE A NUMBER AND I HAVE FROZEN
FEET THAT'S WITH ME ALL THE TIME. BUT I -- YOU KNOW, I
DIDN'T READ TERRIBLY MUCH ABOUT IT. I MEAN I DO
OCCASIONALLY WATCH SOME OF THOSE FILMS THAT YOU SEE ON
THE P.B.S. AND MAYBE I JUST SORT OF WATCH IT IN ORDER
NOT TO FORGET. BUT IT'S NOT SOMETHING THAT I

2 CONSCIOUSLY NOT THINK ABOUT. IT IS JUST -- I DON'T
3 KNOW.

I CAN'T -- YOU KNOW, I DIDN'T COME UP WITH
IT, WHY I DON'T THINK ABOUT IT MORE. AS I SAID, I HAVE
ONE PARTICULAR FRIEND WHO LIVES IN JERUSALEM WHO IS
PREOCCUPIED WITH THE CONCENTRATION CAMPS. I REMEMBER I
CAME TO VISIT HIM AND, YOU KNOW, HE WAS -- HE ALREADY
HAD SIX OR EIGHT BOOKS ABOUT THERESIEN, ABOUT OTHER
CAMPS ON THE SOVANNA. I WASN'T INTERESTED IN IT; NOT
BECAUSE I DON'T WANT TO TALK ABOUT IT OR ANYTHING LIKE
THAT OR THAT I'M ASHAMED OR THAT I HIDE IT. I DON'T.

- Q. WHEN YOU DO TALK ABOUT IT, FOR INSTANCE,
 WHEN YOU WERE BACK JUST RECENTLY AND YOU MET SOME OF
 YOUR OLD FRIENDS, WHAT COMES UP? WHAT DO YOU TALK
 ABOUT?
- LARGE JEWISH POPULATION. AND IT'S INTERESTING. A LOT OF THE PEOPLE, YOU KNOW, MOST PEOPLE DIDN'T SURVIVE THE WAR, BUT SOME OF THEM HAVE. AND WITH THE EXCEPTION OF TWO FAMILIES, THEY ALL -- THEY'RE ALL GONE. THERE WAS PROBABLY MAYBE EIGHT OR NINE HUNDRED PEOPLE THAT LIVED IN A TOWN OF 7,000, WHICH IS A LARGE PERCENTAGE. AND A LOT OF THEM COME BACK AND VISIT IT.

AND I HAVE MET SOME OTHER THAN JUST MY

2 PEOPLE THAT I WAS TOGETHER IN THERESIEN, BUT PEOPLE THAT

3 | COME FROM THE TOWN THAT I -- THAT CAME BACK WHILE I WAS

4 | THERE, JUST LIKED TO VISIT IT. IT'S JUST PEOPLE LIKE TO

5 GO BACK TO THEIR ROOTS, I SUPPOSE.

PEOPLE SURVIVED THE WAR?

AND IT'S INTERESTING, WHAT PEOPLE TALK

ABOUT IS WHO HAVE SURVIVED AND, YOU KNOW, SOME PEOPLE -WE TALKED ABOUT PEOPLE THAT ARE NO LONGER ALIVE. WE
SAY, WELL, HAVE THESE PEOPLE SURVIVED THE WAR AND THOSE

AND WE WERE TALKING ABOUT THE TIMES, HOW IT
WAS DURING THE WAR. ONE OF THE PEOPLE THAT -- A WIFE OF
THIS GOOD FRIEND OF MINE THAT I STAYED WITH, HER MOTHER
WAS EXECUTED. I MEAN I DID NOT KNOW THAT. I MEAN MAYBE
I DID BUT I JUST -- AND WE TALKED ABOUT THAT. BUT WE
JUST TALKED ABOUT THE OLD TIMES AND MOSTLY THE PEOPLE
WHO ARE -- THEY ARE MOSTLY DEAD NOW.

BUT YOU MUSTN'T FORGET THAT I AM PERHAPS
THE YOUNGEST PERSON FROM MY HOMETOWN FROM THE JEWISH
PEOPLE THAT SURVIVED, SO I WAS ONLY 14 WHEN I CAME BACK.
SO THOUGH I HAVE A VERY GOOD MEMORY, I MEAN I DO NOT
REMEMBER A LOT OF THINGS, YOU KNOW. THERE IS A
DIFFERENCE WHEN YOU ARE 14 OR 16. I DID NOT REMEMBER A
LOT OF THESE PEOPLE, OR JUST VAGUELY.

ANYHOW, THIS IS WHAT WE WERE TALKING ABOUT,

- IS JUST HOW IT WAS DURING THE WAR AND HOW IT IS NOW.
 - Q. WHAT KIND OF WORDS COME UP? DESCRIBE WHAT KIND OF WORDS.
 - A. YOU ARE VERY DEMANDING. WHAT KIND OF WORDS

 COME UP? WELL, I DON'T KNOW IF I CAN TELL YOU WORDS,

 BUT I -- THE MOOD IS NOT SOMBER. IS THAT THE WORD,

 SOMBER? YOU KNOW, WE'RE NOT SAD OR ANYTHING LIKE THAT.

 WE'RE JUST -- WE ALL KNOW WE LIVED THROUGH IT, AND SOME

 EXPERIENCES WERE WORSE THAN OTHERS.

AND WELL, FOR EXAMPLE, I HAVE ALSO ONE OF
THE MEN THAT COMES FROM MY TOWN THAT LIVES IN MUNICH.
HE WAS TELLING ME A STORY HOW THAT HE WAS ARRESTED
DURING THE WAR THAT I DID NOT KNOW ABOUT. OF COURSE, HE
IS ABOUT PROBABLY EIGHT OR NINE, TEN YEARS OLDER THAN
MYSELF SO, YOU KNOW, HE WAS IN HIS TWENTIES WHEN THIS
WAS ALL HAPPENING.

HOW HE WAS ARRESTED AND HOW -- AND WHY HE WAS ARRESTED, HE WAS OUT IN THE STREET AFTER EIGHT O'CLOCK. AND HE WAS SENTENCED JUST -- HE DIDN'T GO TO THE GESTAPO; IT WAS JUST BY THE CZECH POLICE WHO WERE COLLABORATING WITH THE GERMANS. AND HE GOT, I DON'T KNOW, TEN DAYS.

AND HE WAS TELLING ME ABOUT A STORY HOW HE WAS IN THE JAIL WITH A MAN WHO WAS -- WITH A MURDERER

WHO MURDERED A MAN WHO, BECAUSE HE WAS GOING AFTER HIS GIRLFRIEND, AND THE MAN SURVIVED THE WAR, THAT MURDERER. AND HE MET HIM AFTER THE WAR, AND DURING THE COMMUNIST REGIME HE WAS SOME BIGSHOT AND HE WENT TO VISIT HIM AND SO -- AND IT WAS ALSO ALMOST, YOU KNOW, IN FUN TALKING ABOUT IT, HOW HE WAS IN JAIL DURING THE WAR. IT WAS AMAZING, YOU KNOW, THAT HE COULD TALK ABOUT IT WITH CERTAIN JOVIALITY.

HE WAS ALSO TELLING ME THAT THE JUDGE WHO SENTENCED HIM, THAT HE WAS CAUGHT AFTER THE WAR, AND HE ACTUALLY CAUGHT HIM AND THAT THEY ACTUALLY BEAT HIM UP ONE DAY AFTER THE WAR. YOU KNOW, HE WAS CAPTURED. HE WAS A CZECH; HE WAS NOT A GERMAN. AND THAT THEY BEAT HIM UP AND -- BUT THESE SORT OF THINGS WE TALKED ABOUT.

I MEAN, AGAIN I WANT YOU TO KNOW THAT WE DID NOT DWELL ON IT, BUT IT HAS COME UP MORE OFTEN THAN IT DOES IN MY LIFE IN THE UNITED STATES.

- Q. DID YOU HAVE ANY STORIES OF THAT NATURE OF YOUR OWN TO ADD TO THE CONVERSATION?
- A. I'M A GOOD LISTENER. NO, NO. AND I GUESS PERHAPS, YOU KNOW, I KEEP ON COMING BACK TO THAT; THAT, YOU KNOW, I DIDN'T RETAIN STORIES. I MEAN I HAVE SOME STORIES. SOME OF THEM I HAVE PROBABLY MENTIONED AT THE EARLIER INTERVIEW.

BUT I WAS -- NO, I DIDN'T. I JUST -- I
CERTAINLY PARTICIPATED IN A CONVERSATION AND INQUIRED
ABOUT PEOPLE AND, YOU KNOW, WAS CURIOUS MYSELF WHO HAS
SURVIVED AND WHO HASN'T.

I KNEW MOST OF THE PEOPLE THAT WERE ALIVE,
BUT THERE WERE NAMES THAT CAME UP THAT I DIDN'T EVEN
REMEMBER ANYMORE BECAUSE I WAS YOUNG AND I JUST HAD, YOU
KNOW, JUST NOTHING TO DO WITH THOSE PEOPLE. I HAD A
GROUP OF FRIENDS AND NONE OF MY FRIENDS THAT I HAD
DURING THE WAR SURVIVED.

AS I SAID, I WAS THE YOUNGEST. AND THERE WERE A FEW GIRLS WHO WERE A COUPLE, THREE YEARS OLDER THAN MYSELF THAT SURVIVED, BUT NO BOYS.

CAN I TAKE A SIP OF WATER?

I HAVE A -- I HAVE QUESTIONED IT MANY

TIMES, YOU KNOW, "WHY ME? WHY NOT THE OTHERS?" AND THE

EXISTENCE OF GOD CAME INTO PLAY AND -- BUT I GUESS

YOU'RE NOT INTERESTED IN THAT. I ASKED FOR IT, DIDN'T

I?

Q. YES.

A. WELL, I MEAN NOTHING PROFOUND; JUST THE QUESTION OF RELIGION AND JUDAISM AND OTHER. I DON'T HAVE A RELIGIOUS UPBRINGING TO START WITH, AND WHATEVER -- YOU KNOW, I DON'T PREOCCUPY MYSELF WITH

2 | JEWISH RELIGION. IN FACT, I ALMOST REJECT IT. AND I

3 DON'T REJECT MY JEWISHNESS, BUT CERTAINLY RELIGION. AND

4 | IT GOES BACK THROUGH MY -- TO MY WAR EXPERIENCES, I'M

5 SURE.

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Q. CAN YOU ELABORATE ON THAT? WHAT DOES IT

MEAN TO YOU NOW TO CALL YOURSELF A JEW AND WHAT DID IT

MEAN THEN, THEN IN YOUR SMALL TOWN AND WHEN YOU WERE IN

9 THE CAMP?

10 A. WHAT IT WAS THEN? IT WAS NOTHING. I MEAN,

11 YOU KNOW, JUST I WAS WHO I WAS AND -- JUST NOTHING.

12 WHAT IT WAS IN THE WAR, IT WAS -- IN THE WAR IT WAS,

13 | WELL, I WAS IN THE CAMP BECAUSE I WAS JEWISH. AND I

14 DON'T THINK THAT I HAVE EVER -- AT LEAST THAT I

15 | REMEMBER -- SAYING, "I WISH I WEREN'T JEWISH BECAUSE I

WOULDN'T BE HERE." I DON'T THINK THAT EVER CROSSED MY

17 MIND.

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18 HOWEVER, TODAY RELIGION, SOMETIMES WHEN

19 | I -- IT ANNOYS ME, ACTUALLY. IT ANNOYS ME BECAUSE I

20 | THINK IT CONSTRICTS YOUR FREEDOM. I LIVED IN ISRAEL,

21 AND WHEN I SEE THE HASSIDIM, THEY REALLY ANNOY ME. THEY

ANNOY ME. ACTUALLY, I DISLIKE THEM IMMENSELY BECAUSE

23 | THEY'RE NOT ENLIGHTENED PEOPLE. AND I'M ALMOST

EMBARRASSED WHEN I SEE A JEW WALK BY WITH PEYES

(INDICATING). I DON'T KNOW WHY I SHOULD BE, BUT I AM,

2 BECAUSE I THINK THEY'RE EMBARRASSING.

I WAS IN NEW YORK A FEW WEEKS -- A FEW MONTHS AGO AND YOU SEE A LOT OF THEM THERE. I WAS JUST SHAKING MY HEAD. I COULDN'T BELIEVE IT. BECAUSE WHERE I COME FROM, WE DON'T -- YOU KNOW, WE DON'T -- CZECHOSLOVAKIA WHERE I WAS, WE DON'T HAVE THIS HASSIDIC ENVIRONMENT TO THE DEGREE THAT IT WAS IN POLAND AND LITHUANIA AND RUSSIA. BUT IT'S NOT ME. IT'S NOT ME.

- Q. BUT WHAT IS YOUR SENSE OF JEWISHNESS?
- A. IT'S A FEELING. IT'S A SOUL. IT'S A SOUL.

 IT'S A FEELING. IT'S JUST -- IT'S SOMETHING INSIDE THAT

 I CAN'T -- A SOUL WOULD BE THE BEST DESCRIPTION I WOULD

 GIVE IT. AND IT -- NOTHING TO DO WITH RELIGION AT ALL;

 ABSOLUTELY NONE.

AND ALL THESE PEOPLE THAT I MET ARE EXACTLY LIKE I AM. I MEAN THEY -- I DON'T WANT TO TELL YOU WHAT OUR FAVORITE FOOD IS. IT'S HAZER; FAVORITE FOOD, AND WE'RE ALL JEWISH. I MEAN WE'RE ALL JEWISH AND WE ARE JUST AS GOOD A PEOPLE AS PEOPLE WHO WALK WITH THE PEYES; MAYBE BETTER. SO IT'S NOT RELIGION. IT'S JUST YOUR HEART.

Q. TO A BOY OF 12, 13, 14 IN A CONCENTRATION CAMP WHO KNEW HE WAS THERE BECAUSE HE WAS JEWISH, WHAT ELSE DID THE RELIGION MEAN BESIDES YOUR TICKET TO

PRISON?

REMEMBER, I NEVER PERCEIVED BEING JEWISH AS RELIGION. I MEAN IT WAS, YOU KNOW, NOT RELIGION. AS I SAID, I DO NOT COME FROM A RELIGIOUS HOME AT ALL. I MEAN MY -- I HAVE GONE TO TEMPLE WITH MY GRANDPARENTS. EVEN GOING TO TEMPLE, YOU DON'T GO TO TEMPLE BECAUSE YOU ARE RELIGIOUS. IT'S JUST A HABIT MORE FOR SOME PEOPLE.

BUT WE DIDN'T EVEN DO THAT, SO I CAN'T TELL
YOU BECAUSE IT WASN'T BEING OF A JEWISH RELIGION. IT'S
JUST BEING JEWISH, WHICH IS, I THINK, SOMETHING
DIFFERENT. AND WHAT DIFFERENT, I'D HAVE TO THINK ABOUT

WELL, I DON'T KNOW, IT'S NOTHING

A. WHAT I DON'T LIKE, AND I KNOW IF I'M GOING TO WATCH THIS TAPE AFTER THIS WITH MY WIFE, THERE'S A CERTAIN HOSTILITY THAT COMES OUT, AND I CAN FEEL IT.

AND IT IS BECAUSE MAYBE A CERTAIN -- HOSTILITY AND ANGER.

AND WHAT I HAVE ON MY MIND IS JUST WHEN I LIVED IN ISRAEL RIGHT AFTER THE WAR AND SEE THE RELIGIOUS PEOPLE, WHAT THEY DID TO US WHICH CURTAILED OUR FREEDOM OF MOVEMENT, YOU KNOW, ON SATURDAYS. SO THAT'S WHERE THE ANGER COMES IN. AND THE FACT THAT I SERVED IN ISRAELI ARMY AND THE RELIGIOUS PEOPLE DID NOT BECAUSE THEY WERE EXEMPT.

AND ONE OF THE PEOPLE THAT I MET IN EUROPE,
WE TALKED ABOUT THE SAME SUBJECT. SHE IS A COMMON-LAW
WIFE OF A FRIEND OF MINE WHO WAS WITH ME IN THERESIEN,
IN THE SAME ROOM. SHE'S FROM ROMANIA.

AND WE -- YOU KNOW, I ASKED THEM HOW DO

GERMANY? THEY LIVE IN FRANKFURT, BY THE WAY. AND SHE

LIVED IN A KIBBUTZ AND HER -- SHE WAS MARRIED WITH TWO

WHEN THEY MOVED TO FRANKFURT, HE PASSED

AWAY. AND TO MAKE THE LONG STORY SHORT, SHE MET THIS

FRIEND OF MINE AND THEY ARE TOGETHER. HER CHILDREN ARE

GROWN. ONE IS A PHYSICIAN AND MARRIED TO A NON-JEWISH

PERSON.

SO THIS IS WHERE THE HOSTILITY AND ANGER COMES IN. SO I -- THIS IS WHY I WANT TO SORT OF -- I CAN FEEL THE ANGER IN MYSELF.

I MENTIONED JUST TO RICHARD JUST WHEN I

CAME ABOUT TALKING ABOUT THE JEWISH BULLETIN. I MEAN

I'M GETTING IT -- I'M GOING TO STOP. I'M GETTING IT -
I'M GOING TO STOP IT BECAUSE EVERY SECOND PICTURE IS A

RABBI, AND THOSE PEOPLE ANNOY ME.

NOW I THINK I WOULD LIKE TO STOP ON THAT SUBJECT. I THINK YOU HAVE MY FEELING. AND I USUALLY DON'T HIDE MY FEELINGS; NOT GOOD AT THAT. I TOLD YOU I'M NOT A VERY GOOD ACTOR.

- Q. OKAY. TO GO BACK FOR A MOMENT AND GO TO THERESIEN, AND YOU WERE 14 --
- A. WELL, I WAS IN THERESIEN IN 1943. SO I WAS PROBABLY 14. I WAS BORN IN 1929; IS THAT CORRECT?

 YEAH, 14; NOT QUITE, 13, 14. PROBABLY 14, YEAH.
- Q. WHAT DO YOU SEE THERE OR WHAT IS IT LIKE FOR YOU? DESCRIBE YOUR SURROUNDINGS.
- A. I LIVED IN A -- WHAT USED TO BE A SCHOOL.

 IN FACT, THAT BUILDING IS GOING TO BE MADE INTO A MUSEUM

 NOW.

DURING THE COMMUNIST -- IF I MIGHT TELL YOU

BEFORE I ANSWER YOUR QUESTION -- THE COMMUNISTS, THE

CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST REGIME HAS SORT OF SUPRESSED THE

SUFFERING OF THE JEWS. THEY NEVER ACKNOWLEDGED THAT.

AND WHEN I WAS THERE TWO YEARS AGO, I TOOK
MY FAMILY. NOW, WE DID GO TO THERESIEN. AND I WENT TO
THAT SCHOOL, AND I HAVE MENTIONED TO SOMEBODY THAT I

AND THE GERMANS HAD NO CHOCOLATE.

TRADE BREAD WITH THE BRITISH PRISONERS OF WAR FOR CHOCOLATE. SO, YOU KNOW, I GOT TWO LOAVES AND I KEPT ONE, YOU KNOW, AND GAVE THE BRITISH PRISONER OF WAR BREAD. BUT I DID IT ONCE OR TWICE. THAT WAS THE ONLY SCHEME I HAVE EVER HAD TO GET SOME EXTRA FOOD. BUT I DON'T KNOW OF ANY OTHER.

SO IT WAS JUST AS I WENT ALONG, I PICKED IT

THE WRITING WAS ON THE WALL FOR THEM. THEY
KNEW THAT THE WAR -- THEY JUST DID NOT -- THEY ALWAYS
LIQUIDATED THE CAMPS, AND PUSHING INTO, YOU KNOW, MORE
INTO GERMANY, RIGHT IN THE CENTER. THEN THEY WERE ALL
CAPTURED. THE RUSSIANS WERE FEW MILES AWAY, AND THEY
NEVER WANTED THE PRISONERS OF WAR IN THE HANDS OF THE
RUSSIANS.

HE DIED ON THAT MARCH, I ASSUME. HOW HE

 PRETTY -- YOU KNOW, I HAD FROZEN FEET ALREADY THEN. AND

 I THINK THAT HE WAS SORT OF ENCOURAGING ME ON, I THINK.

 YOU KNOW, I MENTIONED IN THE EARLIER INTERVIEW THAT MY

IF YOU SAW THE TAPE, YOU'VE SEEN IT. THAT I PERHAPS

BUCHENWALD, AND HOW THE -- FROM THERE WE WENT BY -
AGAIN BY A CATTLE TRAIN TO BUCHENWALD. THAT WAS ALREADY

IN FEBRUARY. THAT WAS JUST A COUPLE MONTHS BEFORE THE

END OF THE WAR.

I REMEMBER HOW THE SHOOTING BECAME LOUDER

- A. IS YOUR QUESTION HOW MANY PEOPLE SURVIVED

 THE MARCH? I THINK IT WAS 4,000 THAT WAS IN THAT CAMP,

 AND MAYBE ABOUT 1,500, I BELIEVE, SURVIVED THE MARCH.

1 LANGER-54 2 THINK I'M PROBABLY FAIRLY ACCURATE ON THAT. NOT MANY. AND YOU WERE THERE, SAY, ABOUT FIVE WEEKS? 3 0. IN GROSSROSEN? DAYS. 4 5 Q. DAYS? MAYBE A COUPLE WEEKS. SOME SORT OF A CAMP HOSPITAL. AND I REMEMBER WHEN THE
WAR WAS OVER I COULD BARELY WALK. I KNOW SOMEBODY FROM
MY HOMETOWN WAS IN THE SAME CAMP. I KNOW I WAS WALKING
ON HIS ARM, AND HE TRIED TO GET ME SOME SHOES AND HE
WAS -- IT WAS SOMEWHAT HEALED.

MY CASE OF FROSTBITE WAS NOT TERRIBLY BAD,
YOU KNOW. I MEAN I HAD OPEN SORES, BUT PEOPLE DIED, YOU
KNOW. IF YOU FROZE, PEOPLE DIED BECAUSE OF DIARRHEA,
WHICH I DID NOT HAVE. YOU SEE, I DID NOT HAVE THAT,
DIARRHEA. AND I HAD THE SAME AMOUNT OF FOOD AND, YOU
KNOW, I NEVER -- MAYBE I HAD A GOOD CONSTITUTION; IT HAD
SOMETHING TO DO WITH THAT. I DON'T KNOW.

BY MS. BACKOVER:

- Q. HOW BIG WERE YOU THEN?
- VERY CONCERNED AFTER I CAME BACK AFTER THE WAR. I
 DIDN'T GROW. MY BROTHER WAS CLOSE TO SIX FEET, THOUGH
 BOTH OF MY PARENTS WERE SHORT. BUT I WAS VERY SMALL.
 THEY WERE VERY CONCERNED BECAUSE I WAS VERY SMALL. BUT
 I WAS VERY SMALL.

I WAS VERY CONCERNED BEING VERY SMALL, AND
I HAVE SOMEWHAT CAUGHT UP AND I GREW QUITE A BIT AFTER
THE WAR. BUT I DIDN'T HAVE THE RIGHT FOOD AT THE TIME
WHEN YOU -- YOU KNOW, WHEN YOU GROW AT THE AGE OF 13,
14, 15. I WAS RATHER SMALL, I THOUGHT, FOR MY AGE. I
WISH I WOULD HAVE GROWN ANOTHER TWO INCHES (INAUDIBLE).

- Q. DO YOU NOT HOLD PEOPLE IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA
 RESPONSIBLE FOR WHAT HAPPENED, PERHAPS A QUESTION OF
 INACTION?
- A. WELL, NO. YOU KNOW, THIS IS WHAT I THOUGHT

 OF THE SABRAS IN ISRAEL. THEY BLAME THE JEWS FOR

 INACTION. IT WAS -- NO, NO, IT ACTUALLY NEVER HAS

 CROSSED MY MIND THAT -- WERE THERE SOME PEOPLE

 COLLABORATING WITH THE GERMANS? YES. BUT THEY WERE, TO

 A CERTAIN DEGREE, ALSO VICTIMS OF THE GERMAN FASCISTIC

 REGIME.

NO, THE ANSWER IS NO. I MEAN, WE WERE ALL RESPONSIBLE. OUR PARENTS, YOU KNOW, NOT DOING ANYTHING, YOU KNOW, NO -- A LOT OF THE ISRAELI SABRAS SAID, "WHY DID YOU GO IN LIKE SHEEP TO GAS CHAMBERS? "WHY DIDN'T YOU DO SOMETHING?" GOOD QUESTION. NO, NO, WE DIDN'T. I DIDN'T, AT LEAST.

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BY MR. KIRSCHNER:

Q. DO YOU FEEL COMFORTABLE BACK IN YOUR HOMETOWN, YOUR OLD HOMETOWN?

A. I DON'T, BUT IT HAS NOTHING TO DO WITH MY WARTIME EXPERIENCES. IT'S JUST WHAT COMMUNISM HAS DONE TO THE COUNTRY AND TO THE TOWN IS JUST SOMETHING THAT MAKES ME FEEL UNCOMFORTABLE. BUT IT'S NOT ANYTHING DUE TO THE WAR EXPERIENCE, IF THAT'S WHAT YOU ARE REFERRING TO.

FIRST TIME COMING THERE AFTER 20 YEARS,

WHEN I WENT BACK I REALLY ENJOYED BEING THERE BECAUSE IT

BROUGHT ME BACK TO MY CHILDHOOD. I ALWAYS TRIED TO

RECAPTURE MY CHILDHOOD, BUT SOMETIMES I'M TRYING TO DO

IT NOW. THIS IS ONE OF THE REASONS I'VE GONE BACK SO

OFTEN. BUT IT'S NOT GOING TO HAPPEN, I'M AFRAID.

- Q. YOU DON'T FEEL THE THREAT OF RESURGENT ANTI-SEMITISM THAT SEEMS TO BE PRESENT ELSEWHERE?
- A. I DON'T THINK IT'S THE CASE TO A DEGREE IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA. I THINK IT WAS ALWAYS DIFFERENT IN THAT COUNTRY. I THINK THAT THE JEWS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA ALWAYS ENJOYED A BETTER LIFE THAN IN ROMANIA AND POLAND.

IN FACT, EVEN THE PRESENT GOVERNMENT,

IT'S -- NO, NO, NO, I DIDN'T, NOT AT ALL. AND I HAVE

ASKED THEM. PEOPLE, YOU KNOW, THE JEWISH PEOPLE THAT

LIVE THERE, NO, I DIDN'T -- I DIDN'T FEEL ANYTHING.

IN FACT, SOME OF THE PEOPLE ON -- LIKE THE DAUGHTER OF A FORMER EMPLOYEE OF MY FATHER, SHE INVITED ME TO DINNER JUST A MONTH AGO. AND SHE SAID, "YOU KNOW, THERE MUST BE SOMETHING DIFFERENT IN THE GENES OF YOU JEWISH PEOPLE BECAUSE LOOK HOW WELL, YOU ARE DOING, YOU KNOW, AND YOU LIVE WELL AND YOU" -- AND I SAID TO HER THAT SHE HAS FORGOTTEN, BUT THERE WERE A LOT OF POOR

BUT THAT'S HOW SOME PEOPLE VIEW IT, THAT
THE JEWS HAVE SOMETHING THAT THE OTHERS DON'T HAVE. I
DON'T KNOW. I'VE HEARD IT FROM OTHER PEOPLE.

BY MS. BACKOVER:

JEWS IN MY HOMETOWN.

Q. WAS THERE THIS DISTINCTION IN

CZECHOSLOVAKIA, EITHER THEN OR NOW, THAT -- I KNOW THERE

WAS, FOR INSTANCE, IN POLAND. POLAND YOU ARE EITHER A

JEW OR YOU'RE A POLE, BUT YOU'RE NOT A JEWISH-POLE. IN

CZECHOSLOVAKIA --

A. THERE IS SUCH A THING AS A CZECH-JEW.

THERE IS. I MEAN, THERE WERE PEOPLE WHO WERE MORE

ASSIMILATED THAN OTHERS, BUT THERE WAS DIFFERENT. I

THINK IT'S PERHAPS DUE TO THE LEADERSHIP OF MASARYK. I

DON'T KNOW IF YOU KNOW; HE WAS THE GEORGE WASHINGTON OF

CZECHOSLOVAKIA, WHO WAS VERY SYMPATHETIC TOWARDS THE

JEWS.

JEWS WERE VERY ACTIVE ON MANY LEVELS. WAS
THERE ANTI-SEMITISM? OF COURSE THERE WAS ANTI-SEMITISM,
I'M SURE. WAS I AWARE OF IT WHEN I WENT BACK? HUH-UH.
ON THE CONTRARY, PEOPLE WERE VERY RESPECTFUL OF THE FACT
THAT I -- AFTER BEING GONE SINCE, WHAT, '44, 42 YEARS -THAT I SPEAK THE LANGUAGE SO WELL, AND THEY REALLY

I HAVE NOT EXPERIENCED ANY PERSONALLY. I
DIDN'T FEEL IT; NOR WAS I PREOCCUPIED WITH IT. NO, IT'S
TOTALLY DIFFERENT IN ROMANIA AND POLAND; TOTALLY. I
MEAN, DISTINCTLY SO. AND I'M SURE PEOPLE WHO LIVE THERE
PROBABLY WOULD TELL YOU THE SAME THING.

- Q. WHEN YOU FIRST GOT BACK AFTER --

APPRECIATED IT.

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- Q. YES, AFTER BUCHENWALD WAS LIBERATED AND YOU WENT ON WITH, AS I UNDERSTAND, SOME CZECH PARTISANS?
- A. WELL, YES, SORT OF FREEDOM-FIGHTERS OF THOSE DAYS, YES.
 - Q. WHAT WAS IT LIKE --
- 21 A. TO GO BACK?
- 22 O. -- ROLLING INTO TOWNS --
- A. I REMEMBER IT WAS -- YOU KNOW, IT WAS -- I

 ON'T KNOW HOW I WAS EXPERIENCING THE FREEDOM THEN.
- 25 OBVIOUSLY WE WERE HAPPY THAT WE WERE FREE. I WAS

2 | PREOCCUPIED JUST TO GO BACK HOME. I JUST WANTED TO GO

BACK HOME. I MENTIONED THAT MY BROTHER WANTED TO STAY

4 IN PRAGUE FOR SEVERAL DAYS AND I JUST WOULDN'T. HE

5 | SAID, "COME ON, LET'S STAY IN PRAGUE." I SAID, "HUH-UH,

WE WENT BY -- TO PILSNER WE WENT BY A TRUCK; THEN WE WENT BY TRAIN TO PRAGUE AND THEN BY TRAIN AND THEN WE COULDN'T GO ALL THE WAY. YOU KNOW, THE BRIDGES WERE BLOWN UP, SO WE WENT BY TRUCK.

AT ONE TIME WHEN WE CAME TO THE SECOND

I REMEMBER WE WENT TO THE LITTLE TOWN, THE

LITTLE VILLAGE WHERE MY MOTHER CAME FROM. PEOPLE GAVE

1 US FOOD, YOU KNOW. WE TOLD THEM WHO WE ARE. THEY GAVE
2 US BACON AND ALL KINDS OF THINGS.

- SOMETHING ELSE WE COULDN'T EAT; WE COULDN'T
 EAT ANY GREASY FOOD. YOU KNOW, A LOT OF PEOPLE DID, AND
 AS I MENTIONED, PEOPLE ATE THE GREASY FOOD AND THAT JUST
 KILLED THEM.
- THERE MUST HAVE BEEN SOME SORT OF A

 SELF-PRESERVATION IN ME AND MY BROTHER. WE JUST REALLY

- Q. HOW WERE YOU FEELING HEALTHWISE BY THE TIME
 YOU GOT BACK TO YOUR --
- A. PRETTY GOOD. ONE THING I WAS FEELING FOR MANY, MANY YEARS, I SORT OF FELT A LITTLE BIT SORRY FOR MYSELF. WHEN I SHOOK IT, YOU KNOW, I TOLD YOU THEN I STARTED MY BUSINESS AND EVERYTHING. BUT FOR MANY YEARS I THOUGHT THAT SOMEBODY OWES ME SOMETHING FOR WHAT I'VE GONE THROUGH, FOR MANY, MANY YEARS; MANY YEARS. THAT'S WHAT PROBABLY HELPED ME BACK JUST -- JUST GO FORWARD. COULD NEVER FORGET, YOU KNOW, WHY DID WE GO THROUGH THIS? WHY? WHAT DID WE DO?
 - I KNOW YOU HAVE ASKED FOR FEELINGS AND I'M SORRY I CAN'T GIVE YOU ANY. I JUST DON'T WANT TO MAKE UP ANYTHING. IT WOULDN'T SOUND RIGHT.
- Q. WHAT WAS YOUR RECEPTION LIKE WHEN YOU GOT BACK HOME?

2 YOU KNOW, A LOT OF PEOPLE, THE CZECH Α. NON-JEWISH POPULATION -- I DON'T KNOW HOW THEY -- YOU 3 KNOW, YOU'RE BACK, SURPRISED. AND THEY WERE, TO A 4 5 CERTAIN DEGREE, VICTIMS THEMSELVES. I KNOW THEY DIDN'T 6 GO THROUGH ANYTHING LIKE WE DID. THEY KEPT THEIR HOMES. 7 WE WERE FAIRLY WELL RECEIVED, I THOUGHT. WE GOT -- YOU KNOW, WE GOT FREE FOOD. 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- Q. WHERE DID YOU LIVE? WHERE WAS YOUR FAMILY HOUSE?
 - A. OUR FAMILY HOUSE WAS RUINED BY THE RUSSIANS. THE RUSSIANS AND THE HASIDIM, I LIKE THEM THE SAME WAY. RUINED OUR HOUSE, JUST -- THEY WERE JUST DEFECATING RIGHT IN THE -- RIGHT IN THERE. TERRIBLE.

 SO IT TOOK A WHILE BEFORE THEY MOVED OUT BEFORE WE COULD GET OUR HOUSE BACK, THE HOUSE THAT THE GERMANS EVICTED US FROM.

- O. HOW LONG DID YOU STAY THERE?
- A. I CAME BACK MAY 1945 AND I LEFT IN 1947,
- 5 OCTOBER. I WENT TO ENGLAND AND I JUST -- THAT WAS STILL
- 6 | BEFORE THE COMMUNIST (SOUNDS LIKE POOCH). I WENT TO
- 7 | ENGLAND AND HAVE NOT RETURNED TO LIVE THERE SINCE THEN.
- 8 I'VE BEEN GONE SINCE '47; A WANDERING JEW.
- 9 BY MS. BACKOVER:

- 10 Q. YOUR MOTHER JOINED YOUR BROTHER AND
 11 YOURSELF WHEN?
- A. I WENT TO ENGLAND IN 1947. MY MOTHER FELT
- 13 | THAT SHE WANTS ME OUT INTO THE WORLD. SO IN '48,
- 14 | FEBRUARY '48, THERE WAS A COMMUNIST UPRISE IN
- 15 CZECHOSLOVAKIA AND THE COMMUNISTS TOOK OVER THE
- 16 GOVERNMENT, AND I GOT THE MESSAGE "DO NOT COME BACK."
- 17 | SO I STAYED IN ENGLAND.
- 18 AT THE TIME THE THEN-COMMUNIST GOVERNMENT
- 19 IN THE EARLY FORTIES WAS SOMEWHAT SYMPATHETIC TOWARDS
- 20 ISRAEL. AND I AM TOLD THE PURPOSE WAS THAT THEY WERE
- 21 | THINKING THAT IF THEY WERE TRAINED, SOME OF THE
- 22 | SURVIVING JEWS WHO LIVED IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, AND SENT
- 23 | THEM TO ISRAEL, THAT ISRAEL WAS GOING TO BECOME A

- 25 SO MY BROTHER TRAINED -- YOU KNOW, THEY

ENGLAND, CANADA, BACK HERE, THEN HERE.

A. VERY WELL, AS A MATTER OF FACT. SHE -- WE KNEW SHE WAS COMING. I DON'T KNOW HOW; IF THERE WAS A PHONE OR HOW WE KNEW THAT. AND THE TRAIN DID NOT COME ALL THE WAY TO -- THE TRAIN DID NOT COME ALL THE WAY TO OUR TOWN. - 10 | FOOD GOT BETTER, YOU KNOW, THE SYSTEM COULDN'T HANDLE
- 11 IT. SO WE JUST BLEW UP; YOU KNOW, I LOOKED, LIKE,
- 12 | SWOLLEN. MY HEAD WAS LIKE -- IT WAS ALL PUFFY. AND I

BACK -- I JUST TRIED TO GET IT IN THERE.

YEAH, I HAVE NEVER -- I WAS SURPRISED,

ACTUALLY, THAT THAT HAPPENED. WASN'T -- I MEAN THE

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN POLAND AND CZECHOSLOVAKIA -- I'M NOT

SAYING BETTER, BUT QUITE A BIT DIFFERENT. I THINK THAT

IN FACT, WHEN WE CAME TO AUSCHWITZ, A LOT OF POLISH JEWS DISLIKED US FOR THE FACT THAT WE DIDN'T SPEAK YIDDISH. THEY THOUGHT THAT WE WERE ASHAMED OF THE FACT THAT WE WERE JEWISH. JUST WASN'T PART OF OUR UPBRINGING. AND IT WAS THROWN INTO OUR FACE MANY TIMES.

IT JUST WAS NOT OUR LANGUAGE AND IT ISN'T
MY LANGUAGE TODAY. I HAVE LEARNED IT AND I HAVE SORT OF
USED IT FOR FUN BECAUSE, YOU KNOW, IN GERMANY YIDDISH IS
SOMEWHAT -- YIDDISH HAS THE ORIGINS OF GERMANY, THE OLD
GERMANY. BUT IT WAS DIFFERENT.

TODAY WHAT YOU SEE ON TV IS PROBABLY -- YOU KNOW, WHEN YOU LOOK AT PICTURES OF ETHIOPIA, IT'S EQUALLY TERRIBLE. YOU SEE WHAT I MEAN?

I SAW PEOPLE JUST, YOU KNOW, WITH DIARRHEA

AND JUST SORT OF DISAPPEARING IN FRONT OF YOUR EYES.

YOU KNOW, I KNOW I -- I DON'T KNOW IF I MENTIONED IT. I

MAY HAVE. FOR EXAMPLE, PEOPLE WERE -- JUST GOT BONES,

YOU KNOW, JUST GOT BONES. AND THEY WERE CHEWING ON THE

BONES AND THEY WERE CONSTIPATED.

I REMEMBER THAT THEY PUT A MAN ON -- THEY

IN CAMP. SO THEY DID HAVE A HOSPITAL OF SORTS, YOU

KNOW, LIKE THEY HAVE A HOSPITAL IN SAN QUINTEN. I MEAN,

IT WAS A PRISON; IT WAS A CAMP PRISON. SO THEY DID HAVE

2 A HOSPITAL.

YOU KNOW, IF SOMEBODY GOT A TYPHOID FEVER,
THE GERMANS WERE NOT IMMUNE TO THAT, YOU KNOW, THE
GUARDS. BECAUSE IF YOU DIDN'T TAKE CARE OF IT, IT COULD
EASILY SPREAD. IT IS A PARADOX, BUT THAT WAS -- YOU
KNOW, I THINK THAT THEY DID HAVE THAT.

THEY WERE LIQUIDATING THE CAMP, WHEN THE RUSSIANS WERE,
