She saved Rivka Bremberg)

Kić Janina, eyewitnessed

She witnessed the killing of a Czech. Jew being killed while trying to escape the executions at the cemetery

She witnessed how Engels executed a child and then the mother of that child while they were walking in the street.

She witnessed how a Jewish woman, marching in a column to the execution site, tossed a bundle into the hands of her aunt. The bundle contained a baby; it was Rivka Bremberg about 3 years old

She witnessed how Jews from foreign countries were begging for food
