

Doris Greenberg discusses her family life in pre-war Poland; how her mother was caught and sent to Umschlagplatz; living in the Warsaw ghetto; obtaining Catholic identification papers; how her sister was captured by the Germans; being taken to Ravensbrück and then to Noibrandenberg; being assigned to work for an SS guard's parents; her liberation by the Russians; traveling to Berlin, Germany; getting arrested in Dresden, Germany by the Russians; searching for family members; visiting an orphanage at Bergen-Belsen; traveling to Kayata Navim, Israel on the ship Champalion; her experiences during the War of Independence; meeting her husband and getting married; immigrating to the United States; starting a family and living in New York; coping with her memories of the Holocaust; going back to Warsaw for the 50th anniversary; experiencing anti-Semitism in contemporary Poland; and U.S. politics.
