

Boleslaw Brodecki discusses his experience as a prisoner in Mauthausen; his time in Czechoslovakia after liberation from Theresienstadt; living in a resettlement camp in Landsberg, Germany; working as a policeman; meeting his wife and starting a family; immigrating to the United States; segregation and civil rights in the United States; moving to Richmond Virginia; working in a tobacco factory; becoming an American citizen; working for Circuit City; the American Jewish Club; anti-Semitism in the United States; Zionism and his views on Israel; speaking publicly about his experiences during the Holocaust; how the memory of his experiences during the Holocaust have affected his daily life; and his views on contemporary acts of Genocide.
