Sylvia Green was born in Karlsruhe am Rein, Germany, in 1924. She is a survivor of Krakow ghetto and of Plaszow, Auschwitz, and Bergen-Belsen concentration camps. She had relatives in Lexington, and moved there after the war. "My world crumbled pretty quick when I came to the US and found out that the world knew [about the Holocaust] and didn't do anything about it," she says. She married Jack Green, of Winchester (now deceased). Adjusting to Winchester was difficult: "People didn't like strangers," she says. She didn't talk about her wartime experiences until 1983, when she made a documentary with Otis Singletary.

This interview focuses on Ms. Green's pre-war and wartime experiences, as well as her life after the war, and her adjustment to living in Winchester in particular.
