

Mrs. van Stam, with the help of her son Frans Pieter van Stam, talks about being part of the resistance; being forced to take in an officer in the German army as a lodger, Toni Sternberger, until September 23, 1943; the officer was possibly Austrian, a former bank employee in Dresden and opposed to Hitler; her husband being betrayed by his nephew and arrested by the Dutch police together with Louis (or Karel) Boesnach, a Jewish member of the resistance; the husband and Boesnach escaping from prison with the help of a Dutch policeman; hiding a resistance member from Amsterdam, Jo Pelikaan; father of
