**Klavdiia Alekseevna Safonova (nee Igoreva),** born in 1936, in Bryansk, Russia. She is in Crimea since 1953.

The Germans had set their home on fire. They had no place to live, so they came to Crimea.

Jews here lived in four-apartment houses. She used to be friends with the Jews and go with them to the club. Her Jewish friends later moved to Simferopol.

Jews had their own cemetery here in village Shelkovichno, near village Mitiayevo. The Jews did not bury their dead at the Russian cemetery.
