

Roman Frayman

- Born in Sosnowiec, Poland, in 1938
- Narrowly escaped being shot in the Srodula ghetto and bayonetted at a work camp with his parents
- Hidden by a Righteous Gentile, Maria Balagova, who raised him as a Catholic
- Both of his parents survived
- From a large extended family; only his parents, one cousin and two uncles survived the Holocaust
- Immigrated with his parents to the U.S. in 1949 at the age of 11
- Legacy includes one son, two daughters, and three grandchildren


