Zev Harel (Sarkas Herskovits)

- Born in 1930 in Kis-Sikarlo, a small village in Transylvania, Hungary
- Grandfather murdered by the Nazis
- Survived Auschwitz, Mauthausen and Ebensee
- Liberated by the Americans in 1945
- Rescued from a ditch by an African-American G.I.
 Participated in the Israeli War of Independence and lived in Israel
- Immigrated to the United States in 1960 at age 30 for graduate
- Emeritus Professor of Social Work at Cleveland State University Legacy includes two children, hundreds of students, and authorship of many books
