



Jacob Hennenberg

- Born in Oswiecim, Poland – the town that became Auschwitz – in 1924
- Forced to leave town with his father and four older sisters, two with babies
- Father and three sisters were murdered during a Nazi roundup
- Survived six forced labor camps and one concentration camp
- Liberated by the Russians in 1945
- Immigrated to the U.S. with his wife and baby in 1949
- Legacy includes one son, two grandchildren, and one great-grandchild
