Jack Kleinman

- Born in Cleveland, Ohio, in 1925
- Enlisted in the U.S. Army at age 18 and became a German translator
- Assigned to help a group of 12 Holocaust survivors, the sole survivors of their entire village in Poland
- Bent Army rules to provide warm clothing and healthful food for the survivors
- Helped all the survivors resettle in the United States or Israel
- Reconnected with five survivors of the original group for a reunion in Cleveland in 1999
