- Born in the Sudetenland, German-speaking Czechoslovakia, in 1927
- Sent in 1939 at the age of 12 to England on the Kindertransport Worked on a farm, lived in an unheated train car, and stayed in a
- castle in England Lived with an uncle in London and went to school to learn English and become a nursery school teacher
- Married an American soldier and immigrated to the United States Parents escaped through Italy and settled in Palestine, where the family was reunited after the war
- Took her three children to visit England and her hometown in the Czech Republic in 1996
- Legacy includes three children and two grandchildren
