- Born in 1922 and raised in a small town in Germany
- In 1938, synagogues burned and Jewish businesses looted on Kristallnacht -The Night of Broken Glass
- Survived the Riga ghetto and the Kaiserwald and Stutthof concentration camps
- Liberated by the Russians in 1945
- Mother was murdered by Nazis
- Joined her only brother in the U.S. in 1945
- Legacy includes two daughters and four grandchildren
