Summary

Paolo Fadda was born in Cagliari on March 30, 1930. He grew up in Cagliari, in the same building where he now lives. In the interview, he talks about his childhood, the fascist indoctrination and how the various youth activities worked. He says that his father had a construction company and contributed to the construction of the city of Carbonia (a new town founded in 1937 to the will of Fascism to exploit self-sufficient coal). He talks about his Catholic education and the fact that within some parts of the Catholic world there was some opposition to Fascism; about the industrial development done in Sardinia by Fascism; about the displacement in the countryside and the huge differences between Cagliari and agricultural Sardinia (great poverty, children without shoes, great illiteracy, no toilets). He speaks of the engineer Guido Segre, one of the Church and the Catholic world in post-war Cagliari and about the bombing of Cagliari. He also talks about the post-war reconstruction and the development of the various parties (communists and anarchists in Carbonia, Democrazia Cristiana helped by the Church in Cagliari).
